#### Proposal from Volunteers In Missions and Disaster Response Ministries



Due to the increasing need for a storage and staging facility for Volunteers in Missions and Disaster Response assets, ARUMC VIM/ Disaster Response Coordinators are proposing to construct a 1500 sq ft metal building centrally located in the Conference.

Wesley UMC in Conway has agreed to provide property for the building. This would be a prime location because of the physical location and ease of access to I-40. Rapid response volunteers live in the area so response time in delivering needed supplies and equipment to disaster affected areas would be more efficient.

The building would be approximately 30ft x 50ft, fully enclosed, with a 16 ft x 50 ft lean-to on one side. A chain link fence enclosure would also be constructed and 2 security lights installed. Proposed budget for project is \$30,000.

Currently, Disaster Response has supplies and equipment staged in various locations around the conference. This can be expensive and causes difficulty in tracking and keeping inventory. Response can be more efficient and effective with all assets housed in one central location. Funds currently being used for storage fees can instead be used for direct assistance to those affected by disasters.

The building would serve as a central location for donated building materials, relief supplies and equipment trailers. This funding for the cost of the building would be raised through donations from individuals and churches.

We have a pledge of \$5000 currently from an individual and approx. \$8,000 in an account with The Methodist Foundation which is designated for Disaster Response. We would need to raise an additional \$17000 more for the construction and completion of the facility.

We would appreciate you and your church prayerfully considering making a donation toward this goal of making the ministries of VIM and DR more efficient and viable to assist in the aftermath of disasters.

#### Seeing Clearly in 2020

Jesus went to Nazareth, where he had been raised. On the Sabbath he went to the synagogue as he normally did and stood up to read. The synagogue assistant gave him the scroll from the prophet Isaiah. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written:

'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me. He has sent me to preach good news to the poor to proclaim release to the prisoners and recovery of sight to the blind, to liberate the oppressed, and to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor'. He rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the synagogue assistant, and sat down.

Every eye in the synagogue was fixed on him.

Luke 4:16-20 CEB

For a few months, I have been joking with people that we will see more clearly in 2020. Several people got the joke, others didn't. (20/20 is optimally clear eyesight! ①) For many, the year 2019 has been filled with struggles, struggles of every kind. Struggles in our lives and struggles in this world. You may have experienced this and wondered 'What is going on?'. After going through a year like this, we pray for the next year, that it will be smoother, that grief, loneliness, brokenness, and struggles will be fewer and farther between. We pray that we will be able to see the Presence of Christ, the Hope, the Love, the Peace, the Light of Christ more clearly than we have in the past.

How do we, as followers of Christ, see more clearly? It is hard to do in a world filled with noise and chaos and distractions that would pull us away from our Lord. This earthly world does imprison us, it blinds us, it makes us poor in spirit, just as the Luke 4 scripture says. When Jesus read from the scroll, he was speaking about us. We are the poor, the prisoners, the blind, the oppressed. To be able to see clearly, we must intentionally break the chains of this world by finding time to spend with our God, in prayer, in silence, in scripture, in worship. In the openmindedness of a small group discussion, our blindness caused by past assumptions and misunderstandings, can be lifted. Be intentional in your pursuit of sight in 2020, intentional in your pursuit of a relationship and understanding of our Lord, intentional in growing in Faith and in Discipleship! I pray that in 2020, you may see more clearly, that you may grow in the sight that only Christ brings, the sight of Love, Hope, Joy, and Peace, the sight of Forgiveness, Reconciliation, and Redemption. 

# From the Organ Console Broc Hite, Organist/Pianist

As I mentioned in my December newsletter, I would be doing no reflecting in this month's edition. However, if you

want to look back at my musical contributions in 2019, you'll find listings on my Website and concerts to relisten on my professional FB page.

I have planned out quite a bit of my music for the first half of 2020 in my brain, though only a part of this is listed. My first recital of the new year will be a short organ recital on Sunday, January 26th at 12:10 pm, titled "From Advent to Epiphany." It features a pair of Baroque and 20th/21st Century words for Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany. It will be the second recital in my new "Curious Squirrel" series.

I switch to the piano in February for the first installment of Chopin Waltzes in a new year of Piano Postludes. I also am planning a program of Prohibition Era music on the piano, which I'm hoping to present as an evening event. I'll be learning a new Beethoven Piano Sonata in recognition of the composer's birth Sestercentenial, to be played at some point in the spring.

The Curious Squirrel is an evolution of the recitals I've been giving at the church for the past two years. While they remain free of charge, I do have a red box in the back that will accept donations towards my continuing education. The church does provide a small budget, but it's only a dent in the real costs it takes to attend conventions and seminars run by music groups to which I belong, like the American Guild of Organists (AGO). It will even help me afford some of the unpaid activities, like an organ recital in Disney Hall, during a leadership conference of the AGO that I am attending in Los Angeles on the weekend of January 12th.
