With consultation from the bishop and our district superintendent, **First United Methodist Church Bella Vista is suspending this Sunday's worship services and all activities until further notice** (Midweek Manna, classes and all activities held within the church). The church office will also be closed. The church staff will be working remotely from home. Unfortunately, we do not know when we will open again. We will reassess the need weekly and send you letters and update news outlets as we receive more information.

As a worshipping community, we will still gather in an online setting. Revered Jeanne will be live-streaming Sunday morning worship at 9:30am on Facebook Live and on the church's website (fumcbellavista.com). Recordings of worship will show on the Bella Vista Community Television (Cox channel 222 and AT&T U-Verse channel 99) on Wednesdsays at 11am. ## **Pharmacy Delivery**

- Cornerstone Pharmacy in Bella Vista will deliver medications Monday-Friday and has currenly
  waived the delivery fee. To arrange to have your medications sent to Cornerstone Pharmacy
  and dropped off at your doorstep, contact your doctor or reach Cornerstone Pharmacy directly
  at 479-976-6200.
- Walgreens Pharmacy in Bella Vista will deliver medications free of charge if you use their Express RX service.

## **Grocery Delivery**

- Walmart Grocery will deliver food to your doorstep! First, you log onto grocery.walmart.com, select which groceries you need, and check out. If you do not already have a Walmart online account, you will need to create one to check out. Note that there is a \$35 minimum order for Grocery Delivery. At checkout, select Delivery and enter your address. There will be a \$6-\$10 service fee, depending on how far away you live.
- Harps and Instacart Instacart is an app and website for food delivery. You enter your zip
  code and preferred grocery store, and an Instacart employee will pick up your groceries and
  delivery them to your doorstep for a small fee. You must create an account first.

Those of you who live alone, please note that if you begin to exhibit symptoms of severe flu or the Covid-19 virus and/or your doctor has diagnosed you having this, please let Marilyn Hertel know at 620-290-1245. This is so that a volunteer may stay connected with you during your illness and call for additional medical assistance when needed. We pray for the health and well-being of <u>all</u> of you, and encourage you to please call Marilyn should you have <u>any</u> of these critical needs.

The uncertainty of this outbreak is creating anxiety in our workplaces, school, and day-to-day activities. Yet we remain certain of God's steadfast presence.
