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New Direction

notes from Pastor Sara Bainbridge



Listening to the bombardment of world and regional news, as we approach Easter we can't help but realize that the world needs an Easter more than just the passing out of plastic, candy filled eggs and fuzzy bunnies. After all, candy, while a much beloved comfort food, makes us either fat or hyper, and fuzzy bunnies become matted in the rain.

How do we live out the Christian faith in a dynamic, changing world? This is the question that troubles heart feeling people of faith, clergy and churches all. This question is also being asked by our Annual Conference. They have been working on the process of asking over the last several years: the Imagine Ministry Team. This Team has been "imagining a different future for the Arkansas Conference of the United Methodist Church in an intentional effort to redirect our focus, streamline ministries and generate mission field work that will effectively grow the Kingdom of God and develop disciples of Jesus Christ who are passionate citizens of the Kingdom." As their report says, "we should be bold enough to recognize the Holy Spirit moving us in new directions that will revitalize our churches and give us a new purpose in an ever-changing world."

Proposals to be presented to the Annual Conference by the Imagine Ministry Team will be discussed on Sunday afternoon April 3rd, 3:00, at the Springdale UMC. All are invited to attend. The full proposal can be seen on the Arkansas Conference UMC website under Imagine Ministry. As I quote from Bishop Crutchfield's letter: "The challenge before us is to move into a future we do not see clearly, toward a goal that seems always just beyond our vision and grasp. Truth #1: the world around us is changing so rapidly, our goals will always be moving targets. Truth #2: strategic planning can no longer declare "if you do steps one through ten, you will have achieved your goals." Truth #3: we may never be finished with the journey. Truth #4: a change in heart and attitude is as important as a change in structure or goals."

What is the future that God is preparing for us? These are questions that our Conference is asking and I believe is leading us to ask of ourselves. How can we as a church be flexible and receptive to the mission field in which God has placed us? These are the challenges, concerns and exciting possibilities of growth in God. How will we respond?

Goat Bank or Bunny Bank



A Log of the BV FUMC VIM Trip to UMCOR Sager Brown, by Jan Lowe

Thirteen members of FUMC BV congregation departed on Saturday, February 26, 2011 at 11:30 a.m. Members included: Ed Jenner (Leader), Jerre Barron, Jan Lowe, Rev. Doris Schlessman, Jim & Sue Prather, Chet & Cheryl Campbell, Darrell & Verna Bottjen, Keith & Lynn Prueitt, and Shirley Hofmann.

We drove approximately half way, stopping in Texarkana, TX to stay the night, and attended FUMC in Texarkana, AR Sunday morning before continuing on to Baldwin, Louisiana. We arrived at UMCOR Sager Brown at 4:00 p.m., in time to be assigned our rooms, unpack, and relax before we attended an introductory meeting at 6:00 p.m. We were greeted by Volunteer Leaders, Bill and Diane Dudleson, and Jan Pettit. After receiving a welcome, and guidelines and instructions for the next morning, we were free to go out to dinner.

Sager Brown prepares a bountiful feast for breakfast and lunch every day. Supper is less filling than lunch but not by much. Meal time was when we gathered to pray, share, and get to know the groups from other places who shared our work week with us. We were fortunate to share this trip with a large group from Texas, and another large group from Ohio. The folks from Texas had been told about terrible floods that hit near their homes on Sunday. The folks from Ohio got word that fires had come up very close to the homes of their friends and families. Much of the prayers during the week were directed at those two groups.

Each day we made a choice about how we would spend our day. Most of the time we all worked in the warehouse, repacking kits, unpacking supplies, or sewing school bags or blankets. Kits available to work on while we were there were health, layette, or birthing. The birthing kit was new for us, and it included all the materials that would be needed by a mid-wife to assist a woman in delivery of a child.

We ended each day with a time of devotions, led by Keith & Lynn and Shirley. Ed saw to it that everyone had a responsibility to the group. We all loved the end of the day when we would come together and share what we had done that day, and share any experiences that had particularly touched us. Sometimes, it was just the feeling that you were really making a difference in someone's life as you worked away in the warehouse. Another person might share someone else's story from one of the other church groups. The people who went into the community shared heartwarming stories about the people they were able to help. A crew did nothing but build ramps into homes so that a person could finally leave their home. It was difficult to tell who was more blessed – the community families who received the help or the volunteers from UMCOR Sager Brown who came into their homes to do minor and major remodeling jobs that they could not otherwise afford to do.

After devotions, we had some free time. Some read, watched TV in the community living room or activity room, and some worked on jigsaw puzzles or played card or board games. Regardless of how we spent our time, it was never too long. We were all anxious to get a good night's sleep so we could be in the dining room by 7:30 a.m. every morning to pray and get instructions for the day.

On Wednesday afternoon, after lunch, people could choose to work the rest of the day or use the afternoon as a leisure time. We chose the latter. Some of the guys had a tee time and enjoyed their afternoon on the golf course, avoiding alligators and other southern critters. Most of us took the bus and went to Avery Island to tour the Tabasco Factory.

Our last evening at Sager Brown, we attended Vespers. People from every group helped to organize this important service to end our time together. Rev. Doris was responsible for communion. She made it so personal for each of us, really reminding us of the meaning of communion. So many people attending were touched by the service. We also had an opportunity to offer up prayer requests and share praises about what may have touched each of us during the week. It was a very special service that will not soon be forgotten.

Ed Jenner booked a return trip to Sager Brown for September 2012 before we left. None of us were looking forward to the twelve hour drive home on Friday. But once we got on the bus, the chatter rarely stopped till we drove into the church parking lot about 10:00 p.m. Friday night. It was a great trip with a great leader. Almost everyone hopes to be able to return soon.
