

## Listening with Ears of the Heart

Most mornings when I awaken and before I get out of bed, I say the following prayers. "Lord, please guide and direct my thinking. Divorce my thinking from self-pity, dishonesty and self-seeking motives. Whenever I become irritable and discontent,

please redirect my thinking. Lord, I offer myself to you, to build with me and do with me as you will. Relieve me of the bondage of self that I might better do your will. Take away my difficulties that victory over them may bear witness to your love, your power, and your way of life. May I do your will always. Oh Lord, that you would bless me indeed and increase my territory; that your hand will be with me; that you will keep me from evil; that I may not cause pain. Lord, reveal my true place and purpose in life."

The words of this prayer upon awakening come from a variety of sources. Some of you may recognize a few of them. I have been praying this prayer for over a decade. It is a prayer rooted in the confidence that God is good and faithful. It is a prayer of surrender to the One who loves us unconditionally, transformationally, and invitationally and who through grace and the work of the Holy Spirit is ever growing us in holiness toward perfection. It is a prayer of hope and assurance that God will use me to carry out God's kingdom work. And it is a prayer of faith, that the One who calls me will provide everything needed to answer and honor God and to love my neighbors.

Prayer is powerful. It is healing and life-giving. It is a gift we give to ourselves and to one another. James tells us, "Is anyone among you in trouble? Let them pray. Is anyone happy? Let them sing songs of praise. Is anyone among you sick? Let them call the elders of the church to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise them up. If they have sinned, they will be forgiven. Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective" James 5:13-16.

I have felt the power of your prayers for me these last 6 weeks. There were days that your prayers, words of encouragement, cards and emails along with the Holy Spirit carried me. Your prayers have been powerful and effective. I have been extremely blessed by the gift of being one of your pastors these last two years. While we know that I will be appointed to another church as of July 1<sup>st</sup>, we also know that we have three months to pray, worship, fellowship and be in ministry together!

Life happens. Sometimes it comes at us fast and furiously as if it is an automatic batting machine that has gone bonkers. Sometimes it is slow and easy. Scripture does not promise us that life will be without challenges or pain. It only promises us that God will be with us in all of life's ups and downs. Let us delight in God and one another between now and June 30<sup>th</sup>. Like Paul said in Philippians 1:6, "I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ."

#### Grief in Sudden Loss

"Do not let your hearts be troubled; trust in God, trust also in me."
(John 14:1 New Living Translation)

I will never forget the Sunday morning I received that unexpected phone call. I was getting ready for church and my husband, Bob, came into the room and said my brother, Allan, was on the phone. I thought, "Uh-oh, something has happened to Mother." I was never so shocked as to hear that my 'baby' brother, Tim, had been killed in an automobile accident. Tim, the youngest of the six of us, was the most playful, the most joyful, the most caring of all of us. I was stunned. There I was going about my normal routine when a sudden downpour in life's circumstances brought on a grief that was profound. The darkness of the rain had just blotted out the sunshine of life. I went into mourning.

You may be in mourning right now after the announcement that not just one but two of our pastors, Bro. Jaimie and Pastor Judy, are both being sent to other churches in July. Grief in sudden and unexpected loss can catch you so off guard that it seems to hit even harder than when you know loss is coming and have tried to prepare. Emotions can be like a roller coaster. Your world has been turned upside down. At first you feel numb, unable to take in the magnitude of it all. Then you may become angry, wondering why this could happen and looking for a cause or causes to blame for this pain. Then you may just enter into a deep sadness, sadness at knowing that life will be so very different than it has been in the past.

Many of us are grieving as we are trying to absorb that our pastors, who have touched our lives so deeply, who have walked with us, have laughed with us, have cried with us, have worshipped with us, will no longer be with us in the coming year. If you are feeling this grief, know that however painful your emotions may be, they are 'normal' when one is in grief. Give yourself permission to grieve; spend time in deep prayer and reflection; acknowledge the emotions you feel; talk to your church family friends; hug them; cry with them; let the tears fall; walk together through this time of loss.

We will journey together in the coming months on a path we did not anticipate and would not have chosen. But, this journey together will bring healing. Our God is Faithful and our church family is strong! With trust in God, God the ultimate Healer; trust in our Lord and Savior, Jesus, who has walked with us and knows us, who is faithful to restore hope and reconciliation; and trust in each other, for God's Spirit is strong within us and between us; the Love which is our God will bind us together in a new unity and a new purpose. We will be made stronger in God's love. Joining together in this journey through grief will heal us and prepare us to begin for the new life which is waiting for us. This new life will begin to bud in the coming months, as together we prepare to support,

and yes, even deeply love, our new pastors when they join us in July. And then as the storm clouds break and the rain subsides, the Son's Light will cause new life to blossom. We as a church family will have grown. We will be ready to welcome our new pastors and, united with them, ready to break into full bloom in the new ministries which lie ahead.

May God shower God's abundant blessings on each of us in our time of mourning, **Pastor Brenda**





#### "Snack Packs for Back Packs" BANK

When Cooper School first opened 10 years ago, only 40 students were eligible for the "Snack Pack for Back Pack" program. This program provides healthy, easy to prepare foods for school age children over the weekend. The school counselor places a "snack pack" of eight to ten items into the student's back pack on Friday afternoon so the child has food over the weekend.

Due to changes in demographics and school boundaries, Cooper School provides 140 + students with these much needed hunger packs each Friday.

FUMCBV has been asked to be a part of this very necessary program beginning with the 2017-18 school year. We'll be responsible for 40 students each week. Other churches and the Samaritan Center in Rogers are picking up the balance of the students in need. We've done the math. We've prayed. We've conferenced. And we feel this is a project that we are being called to do.

You'll notice the "goat banks" are out full time now-one in the hallway across from the Library. The Mission Team's focus is on beginning to raise funds now. We estimate that it will take approximately \$300 per month (1200 quarters!) to pack 160 healthy food bags.

## MISSION OF THE MONTH HAVENWOOD

The Havenwood program provides transitional housing for single parents and their

children in a supportive environment to help families become economically self-sufficient and transition into permanent housing.

Havenwood is a two-year program designed to help single parents overcome the barriers in their lives that lead to homelessness. Residents are required to work or attend school full time. We do NOT offer onsite child care, except during groups or special activities.

Residents are required to participate in our life skill development program that requires working with our caseworker to develop a Personal Living Plan and participating in weekly group meetings. It includes a curriculum that focuses on budgeting and money management, health and wellness, personal empowerment and leadership, workforce enhancement and, family dynamics and healthy We encourage working with a relationships. counselor on therapeutic goals. Residents also receive services include individual case management, referral to resources they need to accomplish their personal living plan and a family like atmosphere to help meet the needs of their children.

Our program helps integrate families into the community and teaches personal responsibility and self-sufficiency. Residents are required to do community service as well as contribute to the shared living areas in the form of chores.

Residents sign a lease with Community Development Corporation of Bentonville/Bella Vista, Inc. and can stay up to two years. Applicants must agree to fully participate in the Havenwood Program. Havenwood provides support, resources, and referrals to break down the barriers each family faces in order to move from homelessness to self-sufficiency.

#### From the Organ Console

Broc Hite, Organist/Associate Director of Music

I hope you will enjoy all of the special music that I have planned for Easter, and the couple of weeks before and after. There will not be a specific composer focus, but rather my reviving some of my favorite pieces for the season, as well as a new piece or two.

I appreciate your support as I continue working through the 46 pieces in Bach's Orgelbüchlein. When I started this project, I didn't realize how significant it was historically, given that this year is the 500th Anniversary of the beginning of Protestantism in Germany. Though Bach came two centuries after Martin Luther, a good number of these pieces are based on chorales written by Luther and his contemporaries of the first half of the 16th century. As you listen to these pieces, you are making a connection with those first Protestant congregations and the brand new hymns they were singing in freedom from the Roman Catholic church.

I will begin playing the Schubert Impromptus, Opus 90, as postlude to worship each Sunday starting on April 30th. This project was suggested as a follow up to playing one of the books of Songs Without Words by Felix Mendelssohn in February. I hope you will enjoy it!
