#### Why a Vision Team?

All churches have a tendency to get stuck in their structure and outlook and have a need for a fresh perspective- a vision- for the future. It is healthy and a sign of a healthy church to regularly visit their purpose and vision and evaluate it. Without a vision to strengthen and grow our congregation, the church will surely die.

#### Who, what, and how is our Vision Team proceeding?

We are a group of individuals, from all traditional and contemporary worship services. We are male and female, youthful and mature. We have been charged with analyzing the results of the summer Coffee Chats and the Worship Survey and with proposing ways our church can move fruitfully into the future. In preparation for this, we attended the Church of the Resurrection (COR) Leadership Institute in Leawood, Kansas last Fall. There are ten of us: Jim Prather, Tim Van Allen, Amy O Fulton, Sandy Fitch, Amy Gilmore, Ewart Scarff, Angie Rader, Michelle Forst, Pastor Brenda, and Rev. Jeanne.

We have been gathering for over five months, sometimes meeting monthly and sometimes more often. We have been studying well-respected books on healthy churches, The Unstuck Church: Equipping Churches to Experience Sustained Health by Tony Morgan and Bearing Fruit: Ministry with Real Results by Lovett H. Weeks and Tom Berlin. We have been attending additional training and planning gatherings with other Arkansas churches which are going through a similar process and we have been using resources made available to us through the Center for Vitality of the Arkansas Conference, (www.vitality.arumc.org).

We have prayerfully considered everything we have done. We have carefully listened for the Holy Spirit to guide us in our recommendations. We have not moved quickly – it's very important for us to listen for God's guidance in all we do. We pray for each other and our church daily. And in the process we are catching a vision of what our church might grow to be. We are excited about this and we pray that you will also catch a glimpse of the exciting vision for our future.

Our first proposal was made to our Church Council on Sunday, March 11. The Church Council is the leadership body which has the authority to approve steps forward for our church. Our first Ah-hah! realization was that all fruitful churches have a clear purpose! So this first proposal was to update our Purpose Statement. FUMCBV has used "Love, Learn, Lead" for over ten years. It has served us well and allowed us to build a strong foundation for the future.

Our new Purpose Statement is:

#### **COME—GROW—GO!**

Come – Welcome all into fellowship in our faith community – all are loved, no matter where you are on your faith journey.

Matthew 11:28 "Come to me, all you who are struggling hard and carrying heavy loads, and I will give you rest."

**Grow** – develop our relationship with God and with each other through study, worship and fellowship Ephesians 4:15 "Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ.

**Go**: Matthew 28:19-20

"Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obev everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

**COME—GROW – GO** is a living, active structure which has as its strong roots our LOVE-LEARN-LEAD foundation. We invite you to come catch this vision as we **grow** into the future **going** out to make disciples together.

#### JOINING in the JOURNEY TOGETHER

Early in the morning on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb. Mary stood outside the tomb weeping. As she wept, ... she turned away and saw Jesus standing there. But she didn't recognize him.

Jesus spoke to her, "Woman, why do you weep? Who are you looking for?"

She, thinking that he was the gardener, said, "Mister, if you took my Lord, tell me where you put him so I can care for him." Jesus said, "Mary."

Turning to face him, she said in Hebrew, "Rabboni!" meaning "Teacher!" (Verses in John 20 MSG)

As spring has begun, we have recently starting sleeping with our bedroom window slightly ajar. It allows us to wake up to the sounds of the birds and to the smell of the fresh air (we live in a wooded neighborhood and we don't suffer from spring allergies). As the spring rains began, I woke up one morning, in the pitch black before dawn, hearing the pouring rain, and the sound of a lone bird singing her heart out. And I thought to myself: Why does that bird sing? What does she have to sing about? It's dark and rainy, what does she have to sing about? Is she lonely, is she crying, is she anticipating, is she hopeful, is she joyful? Why does she sing?

And I thought about the scripture of Mary going to the tomb, while it was still dark, and because Jesus was gone, she cried. And then Jesus appeared to her. At first she didn't know it was Him. But once she recognized Him, her tears of sorrow turned to songs on joy. If Jesus appeared to us today, would we recognize Him? Do we ever pay close enough attention to see His face and hear His voice and allow Him to teach us? Jesus invites us to join in the journey with Him, the journey today and the journey into tomorrow. My prayer this Easter, this Spring, is that all of us will come and grow into the new life that Jesus' face and voice and teaching brings and that we will take that and go into the world singing a new song of joy.


#### **UMW SUNDAY**

#### Calling a select few Individuals or Groups into action

We would like to be very clear, up front, that we have not been given any authority to be making this special request, which is before you. No one on the Finance Committee, Church Council, nor Pastor Jeanne have come to us and requested that we take this action. We requested that it be placed before you for consideration, and responsibility for the contents are solely ours.

We have attended the second service for 5 years. We were made to feel welcome from our first visit and you gave us the opportunity to grow in our understanding of what Christ's calling is for us. Worship and Fellowship with you are a meaningful part of what we experience as life within a Community of Believers.

We write to you today because we are troubled. The operating budget of our church does not look good for 2018 and honestly it wasn't great in 2017 either. Likely you have discussed this among yourselves, as we have, and if you are like us it is easy for the conversation to start heading down the 'rabbit hole' of who's to blame. It has to be someone's fault, right?

We are concerned that beginning the year in a deficit position will have a negative impact on our ministry, not only this year but into the future as well, as we spend the year talking about what expenses to cut, what missions to defund, what activities to cancel. Bottom line - we will become less effective at the very time our Community needs us the most.

What would it be like if we were free to design ministries around the needs of the church that will allow us to see new growth to offset our declining membership, instead of grumbling about our declining finances and the inability to fulfill our mission of **Making New Disciples**?

It is hard to get excited about being part of something that is in decline; the negatives start outweighing the positives; it becomes harder to attract new members because they instinctively feel the lack of energy, heart, and Spirit. Decline, if allowed to continue, leads to more decline.

Our call to you is an attempt to <u>draw a line in the sand</u>. It is saying that we will not move lower from here! We have a choice and we choose to move forward and upward. We will be the church that Makes New Disciples. We will not leave that work to anyone else. We will do it – Send Us!

Here is what we are asking – We are calling on a select few Individuals or Groups, who have been extraordinarily blessed and are willing to 'plant the trees who's shade others will enjoy.'

We are asking for 12 or more members/groups to contribute \$5000 each to the 2018 operating budget, over and above your current pledge.

Surely there are 12 or more individuals or groups, including us, who have received blessings in excess of their hopes and dreams who can answer the call – For Such A Time As This! Perhaps there are Shepherd Groups or other groups who would like to partner together to be '1 of the 12'?

#### Book Nook

#### from the Organ Console

#### Broc Hite,

#### Organist/Associate Director of Music

As you might imagine, there is an abundance of wonderful organ music for Lent and Easter. It would be pretty easy for me not to learn any new music for the season, and just recycle what I already have. But that doesn't serve my goal to learn a lot of new music while I'm still young enough to do so. Plus, there are entire composers whose music I've avoided due to the difficulty or strangeness of it. Now is the time to build a few of these pieces into my repertoire.

Certainly, one composer whom I've avoided is César Franck. His music is not the most difficult to learn, but his works are long, have lots of tricky sections, and require lots of registration changes to be effective. There are other composers like Edwin Lemare, Marcel Dupré and Jean Langlais who seem to delight in how many notes they can throw on a page. With them, there are no easy pieces, even ones marked at slow or moderate tempos.

I've learned to choose only a couple of difficult new pieces a season, so I can do them well. The Pastorale and Prière of Franck are two of these. For everything else, I look at lists from prior years and choose a variety of pieces and difficulties to make sure that I don't spend too many nights toiling away at the console.

So, as the pensiveness of Lent breaks into the jubilation of Easter, the keys may change from minor to major, but the work continues! In order to document my work, I'm recording and posting some of these recordings both to the church Website and to my own Website.
