On of my favorite hymns is "Leave it There" by Charles Albert Tindley on page 522 in the United Methodist Hymnal. Some of the words of the chorus say, "Leave it there, take your burden to the Lord...if you trust and never doubt, he will surely bring you out!"

Do you need to hear these words? As I stood recently at my kitchen sink peeling half a bushel of peaches that were ripening quickly on a hot summer day, thoughts swirled in my head of concerns of many varieties. Most of the time I do not feel overwhelmed, but this particular day that was not the case. I was very distracted by issues beyond my control. As the peachings mounted, I heard myself singing.... "if you trust and never doubt he will surely bring you out, take your burdens to the Lord and leave it there."

As I actually listened to the words I was singing, I began to pray. My prayer was for wisdom, for the concerns of others, and for the ability to handle many things beyond my control. It was to become a prayer of surrender knowing God would quiet my concerns and provide what was needed. I took the dish pan full of peach pits, bruised peelings, and blemished peach pieces to the compost pile. As I poured the contents of damaged peaches out of the pan, I realized that is what I was doing as I prayed. I was symbolically pouring out the damage of being overwhelmed with issues to the Lord who is our burden bearer. Maybe you need to be reminded today, also, to cast all your cares upon the Lord because your load of concerns are heavy, but I also remind you to leave your cares with The Lord!..."leave it there, leave it there, take your burden to the Lord and leave it there; if you trust and never doubt He will surely bring you out, take your burden to the Lord and leave it there!"

Again this morning, my eyes searched for the familiar brown bundles of fur with the distinctive ears as I took my morning stroll among the saints in the cemetery. About six weeks ago, I first spotted them on my early morning walks – bunnies of various ages and sizes. I delighted in watching them nibble on their favorite clover patches and stealthily

freeze as I approached.

Days turned into weeks, and I identified about three bunny families. Each day I found them in various locations nibbling away. One or two became particularly tolerant of my strolling and let me pass by within a few feet of them. I softly cajoled them as I gently passed with only a few feet to spare. Needless to say, I became quite attached to my new furry friends.

Although I noticed several weeks ago that the number of bunnies seemed to be dwindling, I assumed they were temporarily feasting on greener pastures. Then one day last week, I did not find a single bunny. My heart began to sink as I continued to scan the barren landscape. Out of the corner of my eye, I noticed a large shadow sailing through the air. My eyes followed it to the branch of a dead tree where they settled on a hawk. I stopped dead in my tracks as my head and my heart began to take it all in. My heart plummeted. Now I understood. As my feet begrudgingly continued along the well-known path, I began to contemplate the ebb and flow of life, the joys and the sorrows, the consolations and the desolations.

We live in an ever-changing world. Some things change quickly while other changes sneak up on us. Despite whether change happens rapidly or slowly, change is a constant companion.

Some of us thrive on change and are energized by new and varied experiences. Others of us prefer the security and comfort of routines. Whether we embrace change or resist it, we can find comfort and reassurance in the words of the third chapter of Ecclesiastes. The author reminds us that God is with us in the ups and downs, the joys and the sorrows, the comforts and challenges of life.

"There's a season for everything and a time for every matter under the heavens: a time for giving *birth* and a time for *dying*, a time for *planting* and a time for *uprooting* what was planted, a time for *killing* and a time for *healing*, a time for *tearing down* and a time for *building up*, a time for *crying* and a time for *laughing*, a time for *mourning* and a time for *dancing*, a time for *throwing* stones and a time for *gathering* stones, a time for *embracing* and a time for *avoiding embraces*, a time for *searching* and a time for *losing*, a time for *keeping* and a time for *throwing away*, a time for *tearing* and a time for *speaking*, a time for *loving* and a time for *hating*, a time for *war* and a time for *peace*." 

# VISTA KIDS


Kristin Crider, Director of Children's Ministry



It's that time of year again, Disciple Bible Study groups are forming and plans are being made to invite new participants to the program. Disciple Bible Study is an opportunity to begin, or renew, your study of our Christian scripture. It is a series of the sequential studies of the Bible and begins with an overview of the Old and New Testaments and ends with a study of Revelation. This study takes four years to complete, but leaves you with a new and exciting understanding of what the Holy Scripture holds for you as an individual.

For the 2015-2016 year, there are many opportunities for you to take part. A Disciple 1 class will be available for those who are interested. This class is the foundation for all of the other Disciple classes, as it provides each learner with a sound knowledge of the Old and New Testaments — the basis for the other three studies. This class must be taken before you can enroll in any of the other Disciple classes. The day and time for this class is yet to be determined.

The second opportunity for study is for those who have completed Disciple 3 and would like to continue their studies. A Disciple 4 class will be offered on Wednesday mornings from 8:30 to 11:00. Disciple 4 is a sixteen week study of the OT Writings and a sixteen week study of NT Writings including the book of Revelation.

Two other opportunities could be offered if there is enough interest – a Disciple 2 class is one possibility, as we have a number of persons who would like to continue their study, but are restricted by numbers and a time to meet. Another opportunity is the final study from the Disciple program – The Christian Believer which could be organized if there is enough interest.

For those of you who are interested in beginning or continuing Disciple Bible Study, please contact me at 426-6211, or the church office for more specific information.

#### SHOEBOX MINISTRY

After having the month off in July Shoebox is ready to hit the ground running. August is

a busy month as school is starting, which means we will be resuming the Sunshine Sacks to Cooper Elementary School and contacting the shelters we serve. With school starting, the added stress of having to make addition purchases will be present in many families. Often families fall in the gap between eligibility for programs that help fill their needs. Toiletry items such as shampoo, deodorant and body wash are just some of these needs.

Items requested this month are: large tubes of toothpaste (Youth Bridge), full size bars of soap. Feminine hygiene products, and quart-size zip lock bags. Our tubs are almost empty of the items listed above.

We are saddened to tell you that *Hanna House,* located in Rogers, which has served the homeless community for many years has closed. Ed Hughes, who operated the shelter and has been in poor health for the last few years, has finally had to close the doors. A care member of Ed's church, St. Vincent's in Rogers, said many have stepped forward, among them Soul's Harbor, to take in and place the residents to help with the transition. The property has been put up for sale and Ed is being cared for in his new home located near St. Vincent's. Please be in prayer for this very special man who has cared for others for a good part of his 90+ years.

A reminder that we are no longer accepting empty prescription bottles, but they can be taken to AARP recycling center.

#### **MISSION OF THE MONTH**

Since Restoration Village opened in June 1989, hundreds have been given refuge, support and hope in a home environment. Our residents come to us from a variety of circumstances: homeless, often with children or pregnant, needing security, hope and encouragement to overcome the traumas of sexual, emotional or physical abuse.

The first priority of the Village is to provide women and their children with a safe, abuse-free environment while meeting their basic needs for food, shelter and clothing, but a long-term approach is essential to accomplish lasting change and restoration.

We believe a long-term approach is necessary to address the obstacles faced by the women and children who come to us seeking assistance. To facilitate this we evaluate and track each individual situation to determine length of residency. Our average stay is six months to a year.

Goals include life skills – such as driving, budgeting, meal planning and self-care. Goals extend on to include continuing education, job skills, resume and interview preparation. And ultimately, the final goal is for residents to become self-sufficient, productive and whole individuals able to support themselves and their children and be productive members of our community.

88% of funding for Restoration Village comes from private donations from individuals, businesses and groups. 5% from the United Way and the balance from grants. They receive no tax payer assistance from the local, state or federal level.
