A team of 13 persons represented FUMCBV by "being the CHURCH" to two persons who were affected by flooding in The home where the team spent the most time was severely damaged by flooding, as was the homeowner's life though circumstances. The team arrived on Monday morning to find this amazing person had fallen in the driveway the night before and had suffered a broken elbow. Sadly, the lady had been there all night, enduring the mosquitoes and tremendous pain. She greeted the team with a can-do spirit and maintained that outlook throughout the week, so that it overshadowed the circumstances of her life. I witnessed the team devotedly offer compassion and faith in Christ to her through their words, actions, and deeds. The team repaired the interior walls of her home by replacing insulation, sheetrock, paneling, doing yard work, and helping put her home in a better order, as well has spending time visiting daily with her. While she received help, the ones who benefited more were the team members. The team benefited through building relationship and deepening faith in the love of Christ. I knew I would be blessed by being a part of the team, but I never expected to be so blessed by the whole experience of the trip. Troy Jorgenson shared Colossians 3:23 on a FaceBook post of photographs from the trip. When I read the verse, "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters", I realized the team had experienced that verse in action during the week through every nail that was hammered, piece of wood that was cut, prayers that were offered, stories that were shared, and relationships that were strengthened. God Moments

Do you practice the presence of God in your life? What I mean is, do you actively look for God's grace, God's love, and God's touch through the events, circumstances and people you encounter each day? If you responded with, "I haven't really thought about that", you would not be alone. Most of us have never been presented with the challenge to find the moments where we experience God in the daily activities of our lives. But take a moment and consider how your life and the lives of others might be different if we intentionally sought out and gave thanks for the moments of God's presence each day.

Recently, the children at Vacation Bible School were encouraged to identify "God Moments" where they experienced God in their lives. Some of their responses were:

"My friend Abby came back to school." "A friend helped me with a big project." "Seeing friends and getting to play." "When my brother let me play with his toys."

To most of us, these events would have seemed like ordinary, run-of-the-mill occurrences. But when invited to see their day through the eyes of the Holy Spirit, these children recognized "God Moments" in the ordinary and the not so ordinary.

Thank you to all the many volunteers who helped with Vacation Bible School this year, so our children could begin to look for the amazing God Moments in their lives.

In a small group I am attending with other members from our church, we are learning how to meet, build relationships, and share our faith with people who are not connected with a church. The study has encourages us to talk about our faith by sharing the moments when we experience God in our lives. We are challenged each week to share an experience of God that occurred over the past week. It is not as easy as you might think! We have shared conversations with friends, experiences of nature, and encounters with strangers, among others. The funny thing is – when you look for God's presence in your life, you begin to find it more frequently! You might try this challenge yourself. Find one time each week that you experience God and share it with another person.

Last Sunday we sang a hymn that reminds me of God's Spirit in and with each of us, ever transforming us to be the disciples of Jesus Christ we were created to be. Let us embrace the words with a renewed commitment that the Holy Spirit create a new spirit within each of us to see the God moments in each of our lives.

From Darkness to Light

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness – on them light has shined. Isaiah 9:2 NRSV

On Sunday, July 3rd, we had a 'darkness to light' service in Becker Hall. You may have been blessed to be with us that Sunday morning as we celebrated our Nation, worshipped our God, and shared Holy Communion together. You may remember we were having thunderstorms that morning, and at about 9am, an hour before we were to begin Worship, the power went out. Worship was to have been in the Sanctuary, but because of no electricity, we were compelled to make a change to Becker Hall where the light through the windows provided enough to hold our service. About 15 minutes into the service, the power came back on. Our Worship had begun when we were in deep darkness, but as we worshipped our God, on us the light did shine!

God's hand was in the message of that morning. Without the power of electricity, we struggled in deep darkness. But together, we shared the experience; we journeyed through the moving of candles, of hymnals, and of Communion elements. People worked together: some grumbled, some doubted, and some saw the possibility on the other side of the darkness. But in the power of the love in community and the love of our Lord, we all got through it – Together! We had an unexpected loss, but together, in community, the love of our Lord was revealed through the Holy Spirit; the light did shine, even before the electricity came back. In the shared story, we grew closer to each other and to God that morning, and we were all better, each in our own unique way, because of the experience.

Have you had an unexpected loss in your life? Because of this loss, are you struggling in the darkness unable to find the power to overcome? We invite you to join us in community, in our grief support "When Mourning Dawns: Living your Way through the Seasons of Your Grief." In this 10-week study, we will explore the characteristics of grief, what it is, how our culture views it, how it affects us, and how to journey through it. By sharing the story, God's love flows through us and our lives are touched, each in our own unique way, by the healing Spirit of our Lord. The group will meet on Tuesday evenings, 5:30-7:00pm, August 23rd through October 25th, in the Chapel. We will finish the 10-week session before the time changes back to Standard Time for the winter.

If you are grieving a loss, I invite you to prayerfully consider joining in the journey with us in this grief support group. In our shared story, we will grow closer to each other and to God, and we will all be better, each in our own unique way, because of the experience.

FROM THE ORGAN CONSOLE


Broc Hite, Organist/Associate Director of Music


SHOEBOX MINISTRY


Prayer for those less fortunate is always needed.

MISSION OF THE MONTH ~ RESTORATION VILLAGE



Since Restoration Village opened in June 1989, hundreds have been given refuge, support and hope in a home environment. Our residents come to us from a variety of circumstances: homeless, often with children or pregnant, needing security, hope and encouragement to overcome the traumas of sexual, emotional or physical abuse.

The first priority of the Village is to provide women and their children with a safe, abuse-free environment while meeting their basic needs for food, shelter and clothing, but a long-term

approach is essential to accomplish lasting change and restoration.

We believe a long-term approach is necessary to address the obstacles faced by the women and children who come to us seeking assistance. To facilitate this, we evaluate and track each individual situation to determine length of residency. Our average stay is six months to a year.

As part of a trauma-informed response approach, each of our residents is provided with free counseling and advocacy. After arriving at the Village, women meet with our advocate and counselor to develop a goal plan. This plan includes specific life and therapeutic goals that they will work towards while at the Village. These goals are monitored through weekly meetings to ensure the best level of success possible.



As always, we'll be looking forward to a busy and exciting year of music-making for our church and just so you'll know, we're gonna hit the ground running this year by singing our first anthem, "At The Table of The Lord" for the **8 o'clock and 10:45 services on Sunday August 7th**. I'm sure you remember that we practiced this piece a few times last May before we took our summer break, so we should have no trouble picking up right where we left off (sorry Shirley!).

By now, I'm sure most of you know about Pam's concert scheduled for **3:00 p.m. on Sunday July 31st**. She's celebrating her 31st birthday and I hope you'll all be there for the festivities, and to celebrate with her.

On Friday August 12th at 7:00 p.m., Dan Knight will be back with us for an evening of jazz and desserts in Becker Hall, but before that, right after choir practice on Thursday August 11th, we're going to adjourn to Gusano's for pizza and fellowship with Dan and the guys in the band. I'll need to get a count of how many of you – and your "significant others" – will be able to do this so that I can let the restaurant know how many of us to expect. Please check your schedules between now and August 4th so you can tell me whether you'll be able to join us at Gusano's or not. Dan has also written a new piece of music for us.
