## **Producing Fruit**

Remain in me, and I will remain in you. A branch can't produce fruit by itself, but must remain in the vine. Likewise, you can't produce fruit unless you remain in me. I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, then you will produce much fruit. Without me, you can't do anything. John 15:4-5 CEB

August is here, the height of the summer, the height of fresh fruit and vegetable season. Farmer's Markets and local fresh fruit stands are abundant with peaches, apples, tomatoes, grapes, and berries. What a joy the sight, smell, and taste of fresh fruit brings to our lives.

The mission of our United Methodist Church is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. The Arkansas Annual Conference Trajectory for the coming years is, "Creating vital congregations that make disciples of Jesus Christ, who make disciples, equipped to transform lives, communities and the world."

I like the Arkansas Annual Conference Trajectory image. You can see the branches growing out from the vine's center in the phrase, "make disciples of Jesus Christ, who make disciples..." and so on as the branches of disciple making reach out to more and more people. And the fruit which is produced, transformed "lives, communities and the world", brings joy in all the senses of our collective lives, our minds, our bodies, and our spirits. How does this happen? With Christ's love, grace, and mercy as our center, our fertilizer if you will, our lives are fed, nurtured, and grow in Christ's image. And as we grow, we reach out as the branches which produce more and more fruit. And the sight, smell, and taste of this fruit leads to abundant life for all humankind.

Fruitfulness in Christ comes in many shapes, sizes, and flavors. Fruitfulness may be in the welcoming way a person greets her or his neighbor in the grocery store, on the street, or at the door of the church building. It may be the helpful way a person gives a ride or a listening ear or a drink of cold water to another, not just someone in the church proper, but even to someone who never goes to church. It may be the insightful way a person leads a class, or shares a part of their own story, or provides a kind word to someone who is struggling. It may be the compassionate way a person builds a relationship with someone they never knew before, someone different than themselves. These types of fruitfulness nurture others in ways that inspire them to "pass it forward", to "make disciples who make disciples."

Are you producing fruit or are you merely consuming it? Look for ways that you can reach out to others as a branch of our central vine, Jesus Christ. Reach out in ways that spread the love, grace, and mercy of our Lord, in ways that inspire those you reach to do likewise. Join in the journey together with Christ and with others. One of my favorite books in the Bible is Proverbs, so I leave you with this – *Kind words are like honey* – *sweet to the soul and healthy for the body. Proverbs* 16:24 (*NLT*)

It's that time of year again, Disciple Bible Study groups are forming and plans are being made to invite new participants to the program. Disciple Bible Study is an opportunity to begin, or renew, your study of our Christian scriptures. It is a series of the sequential studies of the Bible and begins with an overview of the Old and New Testaments and ends with a study of Revelation. This study takes four years to complete, but leaves you with a new and exciting understanding of what the Holy Scripture holds for you as an individual.

For the 2017-2018 year, there are many opportunities for you to take part. A Disciple 1 class will be available for those who are interested. This class is the foundation for all of the other Disciple classes, as it provides each learner with a sound knowledge of the Old and New Testaments – the basis for the other three studies. This class must be taken before you can enroll in any of the other Disciple classes. The day and time for this class will be determined by those who are interested in this study.

The second opportunity for study is for those who have completed Disciple 1 and would like to continue their studies. A Disciple 2 class will be offered on Wednesdays, the time to be determined. Disciple 2 is a sixteen week study of the Genesis/Exodus and a sixteen week study of Luke/Acts. This study introduces the participants to the foundations of Judaism and Christianity.

Two other opportunities will be offered; a Disciple 4 class will meet on Wednesdays, as we have a number of persons who would like to continue their study. Another opportunity is a continuation of Bible study from the Disciple program –*Christian Believer*, which will meet Friday mornings from 9:00 to 11:30.

All classes would begin the week of September 20th and end the week of May 14<sup>th</sup>.-

Other opportunities are available if there is enough interest. Evening class are always available – the only requirement is that we need to secure a group of at least six people to participate.



#### Beautiful Colors Emmaus Group



## Mission of the Month



Since **RESTORATION VILLAGE** opened in June 1989, hundreds have been given refuge, support and hope in a home environment. Our residents come to us from a variety of circumstances: homeless, often with children or pregnant, needing security, hope and encouragement to overcome the traumas of sexual, emotional or physical abuse.

The first priority of the Village is to provide women and their children with a safe, abuse-free environment while meeting their basic needs for food, shelter and clothing, but a long-term approach is essential to accomplish lasting change and restoration.

We believe a long-term approach is necessary to address the obstacles faced by the women and children who come to us seeking assistance. To facilitate this, we evaluate and track each individual situation to determine length of residency. Our average stay is six months to a year.

As part of a trauma-informed response approach, each of our residents is provided with free counseling and advocacy. After arriving at the Village, women meet with our advocate and counselor to develop a goal plan. This plan includes specific life and therapeutic goals that they will work towards while at the Village. These goals are monitored through weekly meetings to ensure the best level of success possible.

# **MISSIONS**

#### "Snack Packs for Back Packs" BANKS

When Cooper School first opened 10 years ago, only 40 students were eligible for the "Snack Pack for Back Pack" program. This program provides healthy, easy to prepare foods for school age children over the weekend. The school counselor places a "snack pack" of eight to ten items into the student's back pack on Friday afternoon so the child has food over the weekend.

Due to changes in demographics and school boundaries, Cooper School now provides 140+ students with these much needed hunger packs each Friday.

FUMCBV has been asked to be a part of this very necessary program, beginning with the 2017-18 school year. We'll be responsible for 20 students each week. Other churches and the Samaritan Center in Rogers are picking up the balance of the students in need. We've done the math. We've prayed. We've conferenced. And we feel this is a project that we are being called to do.

You'll notice the "goat banks" are out full time one in the hallway across from the Library and one in the west hallway by the entrance to Becker Hall. The Mission Team's focus is on raising funds now so that each month after school begins, our goal will be met. We estimate that it will take approximately \$150-\$200 per month to pack 80 healthy food bags. This last month we collected lots of quarters ~ and we now also have boxes at each station to collect folding quarters!!! You also can write a check (put "Snack-Pack" in the memo) or pay on Sunday with your credit/debit card.

But still more is needed and will be, especially after school begins this month.

Repair work will not begin right away as there are things in the process beyond our control that have to be determined. What we do need is for teams to be ready so we can begin as soon as possible when the way is cleared.

• Flood recovery teams still needed in SE Arkansas. Southeast Arkansas continues to schedule teams to help with repairs needed as a result of the March 2016 floods. Projects are identified and funding secured, but volunteer help is little to none. When considering mission opportunities, please consider our neighbors in Southeast Arkansas.
