Glimpses of Grace Rev. Jeanne Williams, Senior Pastor

The Dog Days of Summer are here! Whew! It seems when the temperature climbs outside, we turn into hermits and soak up the air conditioning. I also notice that tempers seem to flare more easily and people just aren't as patient.

When Natalie was little, we learned a deep-breathing technique called STAR. STOP, TAKE a deep breath, AND RELAX. She was 3 at the time and we could say to her, "Let's be a star!"

And then we would all do the breathing together. And you know what, 9 times out of 10, it wasn't Natalie who needed to stop and take a moment, but her parents. We still use this in our house, but often it's Natalie telling us we have to be stars!

As I read the Gospels, I feel like there are a lot of moments when Jesus probably (in some form or another) looked at his disciples and told them to be stars. Just stop for a moment and take a deep breath. The pace of Jesus' ministry had to be tiring, and they were in a more arid, dry, desert region, which means temperatures could be high at times. The disciples loved Jesus and would follow him wherever he went. We know that there were disputes at times; just look at the debate among them over who was greatest.

Sometimes, we just need to stop, take a deep breath, and relax. Maybe it's while we're trying to get through Bella Vista traffic; or while we're conversing with someone and we don't agree; or maybe it's when we need to simply get more oxygen to our brain so we can think more clearly. I've added something to "be a star." I now say, "Be a star and say a prayer." The prayer may be as simple as, "Lord, help me," or "Lord, be with me." I invite you to join me in being a STAR and saying a prayer!

The Deep Waters of Grief

But now thus says the LORD the one who created you, O Jacob, the one who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior. (Isaiah 43:1-3 NRSV)

How often do we feel overwhelmed; how often do we feel as if we are drowning in the deep waters of life? We all have struggles, Goliaths that we face. One of those giants is called Grief. Grief can be an emotional roller coaster, a deep abyss where escape seems impossible, a whirlpool of raging water that will not let us go. Scriptures like the Isaiah 43 verses tell us that God is with us. But often we need a physical paddle to get us through the torrent; we need to talk through our feelings with another person; we need a listening ear; we need to hear a human voice; we need to feel a human hug; we need "God with skin on."

Beginning Tuesday, August 21st, the grief support study, "When Mourning Dawns: Living your Way through the Seasons of Your Grief" will be offered from 5:30-7pm in the Chapel. We will meet each Tuesday for nine weeks, where we will explore the characteristics of grief, what grief is, how our culture views it, how it affects us, and how to journey through it. We will finish the 9-week session before the time changes back to Standard Time for the winter. By sharing our stories and joining together in this journey, we discover that we are not alone in those rising floods. We discover that God <u>is</u> there as we pass through the waters; we find the current becomes easier to navigate; and we feel the healing hand of the God who created us begin to work in your lives.

If you are grieving a loss, whether it be a recent one or one from a long time ago, I invite you to prayerfully consider joining in the journey with us in this grief support group. In our shared story, we will grow closer to God and to each other, and we will all find healing because of the experience, each in our own unique way. I pray you will join us!

"Snack Packs for Back Packs" BANKS

When Cooper School first opened 10 years ago, only 40 students were eligible for the "Snack Pack for Back Pack" program. Due to changes in demographics and school boundaries, Cooper School now provides 140+ students with these much needed hunger packs each Friday.

FUMCBV has again been asked to be a part of this very necessary program, in the 2018-19 school year. We'll be responsible for 20 students each week. Other churches and the Samaritan Center in Rogers are picking up the balance of the students in need. You'll



notice the "goat banks" are out full time -one in the hallway across from the Library and one in the west hallway by the entrance to Becker Hall. The Mission Team's focus is on raising funds now so that each month after school begins, our goal will be met. We estimate that it will take approximately \$150-\$200 per month to pack 80 healthy food bags. This last year we collected lots of quarters ~ and folding quarters!!! You also can write a check (put "Snack-Pack" in the memo) or pay on Sunday with your credit/debit card in the office. Most months we meet our goal, but still more is needed and will be, especially after school begins again the middle of August.

AUGUST **MISSION of the MONTH**

Since **Restoration Village** opened in June 1989, hundreds have been given refuge, support and hope in a home environment. Our residents come to us from a variety of circumstances: homeless, often with children or pregnant, needing security, hope and encouragement to overcome the traumas of sexual, emotional or physical abuse.

The first priority of the Village is to provide women and their children with a safe, abuse-free environment while meeting their basic needs for food, shelter and clothing, but a long-term approach is essential to accomplish lasting change and restoration.

We believe a long-term approach is necessary to address the obstacles faced by the women and children who come to us seeking assistance. To facilitate this we evaluate and track each individual situation to determine length of residency. Our average stay is six months to a year.

As part of a trauma-informed response approach, each of our residents is provided with free counseling and advocacy. After arriving at the Village, women meet with our advocate and counselor to develop a goal plan. This plan includes specific life and therapeutic goals that they will work towards while at the Village. These goals are monitored through weekly meetings to ensure the best level of success possible.

We also employ a two-generation approach identified by the Aspen Institute, for reducing child poverty. The approach acknowledges that "The future success of children depends on the more short-term success of their parents. This strategy combines child-focused and parent-focused efforts to create an all-inclusive family model."

CREDIT/DEBIT MACHINE – for those who use the credit/debit machine on Sunday in the Narthex or would like to use it during the week, please come to the Office for your transaction. This will no longer be taking place in the Narthex. If you will have the amount you wish to pay written on our form, the transaction can take place without your amount ever being verbalized. Some have had concerns over the fact that others can overhear what they are paying, and that is entirely a private and confidential matter. We will try to be as discrete as possible, and not disclose your personal information. An alternative plan is for you to sign up for automatic withdrawal from your checking account. Forms are available in the office to do this.

The next set of Piano Postludes begins on Sunday, August 5th, with another four preludes and fugues of J.S. Bach. Each set has its own character, charm, and difficulty. If you're looking for a more varied program, don't fear, the Autumn Leaves concert series features a short piano recital on September 16th at noon!

The preludes and offertories will be largely by American composer Dale Wood. He is most famous for accessible arrangements on hymn tunes, in many volumes with the clever title of Wood Works. Though he passed in 2003, I shared an elevator with him at the National Convention of the American Guild of Organists (AGO) in New York City in 1996. He was grumbling to a colleague about something, so it wasn't a stellar opportunity to introduce myself.

And that's my segue into where I was during the first week of July. The most recent national convention of the AGO took place in Kansas City, and this was the first time since 1996 that I had the opportunity to attend. I'm really grateful to the church for covering my registration fee and a small part of my housing, as the result of a promised home stay that fell through.

Despite that help, it was still really expensive since I had to cover transportation, all meals, the balance of housing, and parking. I will be more aggressive about soliciting help for expenses next time, but I promise to give you some nice concerts as an enticement! Please contact me if you'd like to help fund a future convention - there's a national one in Atlanta in 2020 and a regional one in nearby Tulsa in 2021. Before then, I'll figure out how to get a fund set up through the church in order to allow your donations to be tax deductible!

MISSION OPPORTUNITY for YOU!



What is Sager Brown? It is an UMCOR (United Methodist Committee On Relief) sponsored depot in Baldwin, Louisiana that is the headquarters for their relief supply operations. Approximately \$4 million in supplies are shipped each year from the depot to people in need around the world and across the US. They also reach out to the local Baldwin community through housing rehabilitation and food distribution programs. The more than 2,000 volunteers who come through Sager Brown each year make this all happen.

Our church has been sending VIM (Volunteer in Missions) teams of around 12 members for many years. It does involve some personal expenses including charges for lodging and meals provided on the 23 acre campus. However, we do have scholarship money available.
