Sara Says...

Have you noticed that we have new end of the world predictions? The latest is 2012. Movies, T.V. shows are plowing the air ways, and of course the spin off productions that show the pain of survival when catastrophes spin people into the aggressive animal behaviors. The end times are talked about in the Bible, called the apocalyptic writings, which, of course, Revelations being one. Throughout history people have studied the Scripture in order to predict the exact time of the end of the world, as if some magic code was written there .

At this time in our Christian year, when we celebrate the birth of Jesus the Christ, we are reminded once again the specifics of God's calendar are crouched not in our linear way of thinking but in Christ's words "*You will know neither the day or the hour.*"(Matthew 25:13)

As Christians, we have a different understanding of time. We (and also Jews and Muslims) believe that history is not aimless or unguided. History belongs to God. History, and therefore time, is God's Story: It's going somewhere. Believing that there is meaning and purpose and direction to history gives human life hope.

Also as Christians, we believe that God's hope took human form in the man of Jesus Christ. 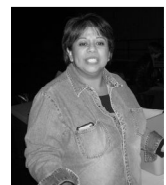

MISSION OF THE MONTH



The United Methodist Children's Home has been serving families and children for more than 100 years. Initially created as an orphanage, now renamed Methodist Family Health, the

home has expanded its services to provide children and families with a continuum of care—an emergency shelter, therapeutic foster care, therapeutic pre-school day treatment, residential homes, psychiatric residential treatment centers, a counseling clinic, and the Methodist Behavioral Hospital.

The Methodist Family Health Mission Statement says it all: "With God's guidance and within the Wesleyan focused healing-and-caring tradition, we will express God's love by providing quality compassionate behavioral healthcare to those we serve."

We had a great turnout of workers from our Church for



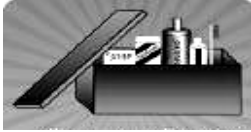

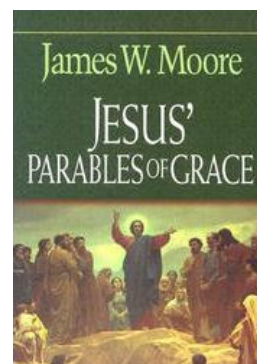

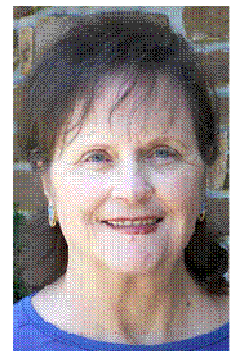

Eve Service, or designate them to be
given to others.**
