

RIO BRAVO MISSION TRIP

The Northwest and West District Mission Trip to Rio Bravo, Mexico



Rio Bravo has been the site of an ongoing United Methodist mission for many years and is sponsored and operated by The United Methodist Church of Mexico. It is located near the larger city of Reynosa just across the border from McAllen, TX. Our contact in Mexico is Guillermo Berman, a GBGM Missionary (#3019612) and the trip is being organized through the VIM office of the Arkansas Annual Conference and the South Central Jurisdiction. This trip is planned over Spring Break 2012.

This is the timeline for the Mission Trip:

Sunday, March 18: Leave Arkansas early in the morning and arrive in McAllen that night

March 19: Cross into Mexico for orientation and the first day of work March 20-22: Work on assigned projects in Rio Bravo and Reynosa

March 23: Finish work and stay the night in McAllen Saturday, March 24: Arrive back in NW Arkansas

Anyone, regardless of skill, over the age of 18 (sorry, no exceptions) is welcome to come on what is

sure to be an incredible mission experience. This trip is as much about building relationships as it is about construction. Projects will be decided by the Rio Bravo church leadership but may include building houses, schools, churches, and playground equipment. There is a hard cap at 50 people on this trip and it is first come, first serve. The cost is \$200 per person and that covers everything except food on the drive to and from McAllen. In order to reserve a spot, an application must be completed AND a deposit of \$50 must be received no later than January 15. **A CURRENT US PASSPORT IS MANDATORY** so if you don't have one, you need to make sure you have completed an application at the post office by mid January to ensure you will have received it by March 18.



If you are unable to come on this trip, don't worry, you will have other opportunities. This will be the start of an ongoing relationship with our brothers and sisters in Reynosa and Rio Bravo, and subsequent trips are planned. If you are interested in going but cannot afford the \$200 cost, financial assistance is available. If you would like to support the trip but are unable to go, contributions are welcome and will go towards those who need financial assistance. Mission of the Month: NORTHWEST ARKANSAS CHILDREN'S SHELTER

The Northwest Arkansas Children's Shelter is a private, nonprofit organization that provides 24-hour emergency residential care to children who are victims of family violence, neglect, and physical and sexual abuse.

The Children's Shelter is designed to meet the needs of these children by providing them with a safe and loving environment to reduce their trauma, through support and nurturing.

We are staffed and ready, day and night, taking in and caring for children in crisis. Children may stay with us for up to 45 days in a six-month period, before being placed in another foster-care setting or returning to their families.


Since opening in 1993, the Children's Shelter has cared for more than 5,500 children from throughout the state of Arkansas. Our capacity of 48 beds, state-of-the-art complex, on-site school and on-site counseling services make us unique among children's emergency shelters in Arkansas and our region. The combination of these features creates a stable, secure and loving environment where the hurts that children have experienced can begin to heal.

The proposed budget will be presented to the Church Council for approval in the new year. The finance committee has worked very diligently to present a conservative budget. A new support group ministry, led by Rev. Doris Schlessman, will get under way beginning Thursday, January 5 from 10:00am to 11:30 am in the Chapel.


If you are grieving the loss of a loved one, or if you are experiencing pain from loss or change, or fear, come to this weekly group gathering.

- 7. (a) Acceptance

The Green Church Project

Finding ways to be better stewards of all of our resources

From the Green Bible:

"Humanity is part of all creation. We are meant to live in an interconnected, interdependent relationship with God and the whole of creation, acting as stewards of creation. And as we care for the earth, the earth cares for us."

In 2012 The Green Team wants to continue to be conscious of our responsibility of working with the congregation in being better stewards. One of the efforts will be in the elimination of the use of Styrofoam, and reduction of other paper kitchen goods. Please share your ideas. We have already received some ideas and a valuable offer of help in achieving these goals. We will continue to work with the Board of Directors in maintaining our building and to address more economical energy saving lighting.

Suggestions of appropriate ideas and actions to achieve these goals are welcomed by all of us on the Team. Our meetings are scheduled on the third Wednesday of the month at 6:30 p.m. in the Chapel. Please feel free to join us.

- ENERGY STAR® products cost a bit more up front, but they use 25-60% less energy, which in turn is better for the environment AND saves you money.
- Contrary to what you might have heard before, the EPA says computers can last up to 10 times longer by turning them off when not in use.
- Televisions, computers and other electronics draw electricity even when they are turned off.
 When you plan to be gone from home any length of time, unplug them.
- 22% of your home energy costs are for space heating. Setting the thermostat one degree lower will lower your energy consumption and save you between \$14 and \$26 a year in Arkansas. And you probably won't notice the one degree difference.
- 13% of your home energy costs are for heating water. Set the temperature of your water heater between 110°F and 120°. (Measure temp at the faucet with a candy thermometer.) Save energy, money and reduce risk of scalding.



This month we recognize Keith Sterwald for his many hours spent identifying areas of the church which need revamping. He began working with the Green Team in identifying these areas , and as a result, cost-saving projects such as installing new thermostats and light switches, adding more insulation in many ceiling areas, connecting and re-routing heating and cooling ducts, and installing air vents in walls and doors, have saved the church many hundreds of



dollars in the past six months. Much of the labor for these projects was done by Keith alone, but for a few tasks he has been assisted by members of the Board of Directors and others. If you have been to Becker Hall lately, you have seen his latest project - building a camera platform for the new equipment Troy Jorgensen will be using to record the Contemporary services and other events there. There are unfinished and new projects in the works which will continue to be cost- effective for us all. Kudos and much appreciation to Keith for a job well done!!


