


January 13 is TRAINING DAY!

JOINING in the JOURNEY TOGETHER

The Journey

No doubt about it: the LORD your God has blessed you in all that you have done. He watched over your journey through that vast desert. Throughout these forty years the LORD your God has been with you. You haven't needed a thing. Deuteronomy 2:7 (CEB)

There is an ancient Chinese proverb that says, "A journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step." In October of 2010, I took that first step. I responded to a call from God into ordained ministry by contacting my pastor and letting him know of my call. With the support of my local church through the pastor and approval from the SPRC, I began the journey. As the steps through the process were taken, I became a certified candidate for ministry; then began my seminary education at SMU/Perkins School of Theology in Dallas in January 2011. I lived in Dallas for three and a half years, coming home to Fayetteville every 2-3 weeks to reunite with my husband, who kept the home fires burning. My internship for my Masters of Divinity was done here with you at First UMC in Bella Vista for the 2014-2015 academic year. Together we developed the current Grief Support ministry during that year. My graduation from Perkins was in May of 2015.

But that was not the end of the journey, for the United Methodist Church requires that certified candidates with the proper educational background, gifts, and graces must go through additional written and oral examination before becoming ordained pastors. Upon approval from those examinations, I was able to enter into provisional membership with the Conference, and was commissioned as a provisional deacon in June of 2016. I have had the pleasure of serving my two years of provisional membership here with all of you at FUMC as together we have grown as a church family and have engaged in our current form of the Congregational Care ministry.

And so, 7+ years later, the last leg of this ordination journey is upon me. I am about to once again go through written and oral examinations for final approval as an ordained deacon in full connection with the Arkansas Conference. The next 6 weeks I will be writing and submitting that writing by the end of January; then will travel to Conway for oral examination on February 19-20.

You may be thinking, "Phew!!" Me, too! (And we wondered why we are called "Method-ists." J) While it hasn't been forty years or a thousand miles, it has been a long journey through the ordination process. There were some times when it felt like I was wandering in a vast desert, but all along the way, the Lord has been with me. I trusted the Lord my God would provide. The lesson of how to trust has been a big part of my journey.

Now I ask for your prayers and your support, especially as I go through the writing and the oral exams in the next weeks. Please keep me in prayers for perseverance, for listening for guidance, for inspiration, and for trust that the Lord will once again lead me through the final leg of this ordination journey.

I thank you for all your prayers and your blessings! Pastor Brenda

Welcome to 2018. I hope everyone had a great Christmas, and are looking forward to a great New Year. I want to


thank so many people for a great year.




in the community. Congratulations, Chet—well done!

It's time for a party! Come rock your groovy hair net and those awesome gloves – and let's pack 12,000 meals for the hungry in Northwest Arkansas.



Again this January, our Mission of the Month is Pack Shack. We will host our Feed the Funnel party on Saturday, February 3 at 10:00 in Becker Hall. This year, we have invited Gravette and Decatur United Methodist Churches to join our party. Rumor has it that the Boy Scouts will join us as well.

Hunger is still an issue in Northwest Arkansas. The Arkansas Conference of the United Methodist Church 200,000 Reasons initiative speaks to the need of childhood hunger in our State. One in four children in Arkansas live in food insecure homes. According to the Arkansas Hunger Alliance, nearly one quarter of all Arkansans over the age of 60 are food insecure.

We ask that you direct you Mission giving this month to Pack Shack. At 25 cents a meal, \$5 pays for a fancy coffee or 20 meals. \$20 pays for dinner out or 80 meals. To pack 12,000 meals – we need to raise \$3,000.
