

Changes in Mission of the Month

Happy New Year! With a new year, we are looking at new ways to be more active in our mission outreach. We are going to try focusing on an issue in our area with not only giving, but also with hands on activities outside our walls.

For the first quart of the year, we are focusing on homelessness in Northwest Arkansas.

For over twenty years, the Shoebox Ministry team has provided shoeboxes filled with person hygiene items for homeless folks in Benton and Washington Counties. Boxes are packed and provided to 7 Hills Homeless Shelter, Salvation Army in Benton and Washington Counties, the Northwest Arkansas Women's Shelter to name a few. Many of the items in these boxes are donated by you – those shampoo, conditioner, lotion and soaps you pick up from your hotel stays and bring to the church. But some items need to be purchased – toothbrushes and toothpaste, socks, band-aids, laundry soap.

Shoebox Ministry also provides Sunshine Sacks to Cooper School for students who may not have access to hygiene items and provides the supplies for the Gravette schools for their health week each year.

Our monetary giving focus for January will be to the Shoebox Ministry to enable them to continue to provide these needed items to the homeless in Northwest Arkansas.

Watch this space and your Sunday Bulletin for more activities to work with the homeless in our community in the coming months.
