## LAY LEADER REPORT

News from the Arkansas Conference of the United Methodist Church.

Sara Bainbridge, reappointed as our pastor and Lee Myane, an Associate, has been appointed to serve our church for the coming year.

Bishop Charles N. Crutchfield's Episcopal address focused on the Imagine Ministry process now underway in the Arkansas Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church.

"Because of the great change now occurring, we must find new ways to communicate the timeless Gospel and to find new ways to live out the Gospel in our lives. There has to be, and there will be, a transformation in the way we do church in Arkansas."

Bishop Nkulu Utanda Ntambo, a United Methodist bishop from the Democratic Republic of the Congo shared the gospel at the Annual Conference and thanked our Conference for providing clean drinking water and mosquito netting to his people.

Lay address imagines the future and emphasizes how we do church in the future will be different if we are to grow and develop disciples of Jesus Christ. The Imagine Ministry Team does not have the answers but is processing the responses to develop and re-imagine The United Methodist Church of Arkansas. This process will take at least two years.

An inspiring worship service preceded and followed each session.

Six resolutions were considered:

Resolution #1: On care of the environment—passed

Resolution #2: On Hospitality—Passed, with amendment that this would not promote illegal immigration.

Resolution #3: To serve the poorest communities of the Conference—Referred back to the committee for considerations in 2011.

Resolution #4: To provide funds to congregations serving the poorest communities of the Conference--failed

Resolution #5: Universal access to health care—Passed as amended.

Resolution #6: Judicial Council to reconsider and issue new decision and direct that any prospective members denied membership in the Church as a result of prior decision be granted admission—Passed

Retirees and ministries were honored. Scholarships were awarded and individuals and churches were recognized. The ordination service, Tuesday evening June 8, was a highlight of the Conference.


#### **OCTOBER 18-22 LEAVES OF GOLD**

Accordingly, we have a six-day VIM working trip to the UMCOR (United Methodist Commission on Relief) Sager-Brown Depot in Baldwin, Louisiana scheduled from February 27 to March 5, 2011. The work will mainly consist of assembling functional "kits" of emergency supplies which UMCOR will ship to distressed areas wherever in the world they are needed.

We have reserved 14 "slots." Of those, eight have already been spoken for. If you would care to go, please call the church office as-soon-as-possible at 855-1158. While at Sager-Brown, VIM team members stay in comfortable quarters and enjoy delicious meals prepared and served in a terrific dining facility by a professional staff.

Putting our faith into action is at the very heart of our Christian calling. The New Testament instructs His followers to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, give shelter to the homeless, heal the sick, care for the widows, and nurture the children. Through VIM, every person in the church has the opportunity to serve and live their lives more faithfully. When you reach out and use what God has given, you will experience a profound life-transformation.

We realize that some of you have other commitments during the day, and some of you would have difficulty handing the rigors and work demands of this mission trip. However, anyone can become a member of the VIM team by providing funds to offset the costs of a trip, which, at present, come to \$205 per person at Sager-Brown plus travel costs. There is an account maintained by the FUMC Bella Vista Finance Office for VIM needs.
