New Relationships of Caring

And again Jesus said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." And Jesus replied, "Tend my sheep." (John 21:16 NRSV)

On Sunday, June 11, a new caring ministry was begun in the life of our church family. Congregational Care Ministers (CCM's), Elaine Detlefsen, Maryann Johnson, Kandi Mount, and Jim Rowland, were commissioned by Bro. Jaimie, giving them full authority to care for the Lord's sheep, members of our church family, in ways that are in partnership with the pastors of the church. All Christians, laity and clergy, are in ministry for our Lord, called to use their individual gifts and graces in Christ's ministry of outreaching love. CCM's have a heart for God's people which is rooted in their strong heart for our Lord. Caring which a CCM shares is more than giving a ride, taking a meal, or sending a card. It involves creating a relationship of trust, compassion, and encouragement with another. In our broken world, this caring involves joining in the journey with another, regardless of the type of journey. Through this relationship of trust and compassion on the shared journey, space is made for God to be present. And when we make space for God, God always shows up, providing the healing and restoration of spirit and relationship which we all seek; which we all need to heal our brokenness. We expect this ministry of caring to grow, as many of you are touched along the way and as more of you are called into this relationship with others. As the invitation to become a part of this ministry is extended in the coming months, we pray you will consider joining in the journey to tend the sheep of our Lord and in echoing the chorus, "Here I am Lord, I will hold your people in my heart."



What a busy, excitina month filled with food, fellowship, and even a musical! were We SO blessed to have the Agape singers from









vision is of a world where everyone has a decent place to live. Habitat works toward this vision by building and improving homes in partnership with individuals and


Care and Share Food Pantry in Gravette will be receiving our collections

"Snack Packs for Back Packs" BANKS

When Cooper School first opened 10 years ago, only 40 students were eligible for the "Snack Pack for Back Pack" program. This program provides healthy, easy to prepare foods for school age children over the weekend. The school counselor places a "snack pack" of eight to ten items into the student's back pack on Friday afternoon so the child has food over the weekend.

Due to changes in demographics and school boundaries, Cooper School now provides 140+ students with these much needed hunger packs each Friday.

FUMCBV has been asked to be a part of this very necessary program, beginning with the 2017-18 school year. We'll be responsible for 20 students each week. Other churches and the Samaritan Center in Rogers are picking up the balance of the students in need. We've done the math. We've prayed. We've conferenced. And we feel this is a project that we are being called to do

You'll notice the "goat banks" are out full time one in the hallway across from the Library and one in the west hallway by the entrance to Becker Hall. The Mission Team's focus is on raising funds now so that each month after school begins, our goal will be met. We estimate that it will take approximately \$150-\$200 per month to pack 80 healthy food bags. This last month we collected lots of quarters ~ and we now also have boxes at each station to collect folding quarters!!! You also can write a check (put "Snack-Pack" in the memo) or pay on Sunday with your credit/debit card. But still more is needed and will be, especially after school begins in August.




