





As you move about your summer plans, look for opportunities to worship in new places, to share kindness and love where you are, and to remember that God is always with you.



Compassion and Justice

He has told you, human one, what is good and what the LORD requires from you: to do justice, to embrace compassionate and faithful love, and to walk humbly with your God.

Micah 6:8 (CEB)

I am a child of the '60's and a song from that era which I distinctly remember was "What the World Needs Now" written by Burt Bacharach and sung by Jackie DeShannon. The chorus goes like this...

What the world needs now is love, sweet love. It's the only thing that there's just too little of. What the world needs now is love, sweet love, No, not just for some but for everyone.

No, not just for some, oh, but just for everyone.

Did You Know?

Helping Hands started 42 years ago when a single mother who had lost everything needed help. Her church

put out a request to its members for donations to help her and when they had such an overflow of items, they decided to keep them and give them to any others that may need things. When other churches heard what they were doing, they decided that was a good idea and when the donations grew to be overwhelming, the idea of a store to sell it in came up. And Helping Hands was born!

So now the store at 2602 SW D Street in Bentonville not only sells low cost used items but has grown to include a Food Pantry that provides food daily for more than 260 people. Over 86 cents of every dollar goes back into the community by giving out over 2 million dollars in assistance to Benton County residents yearly. It now operates with a small paid staff and over 100 volunteers. Our church has participated since the beginning by providing workers on 3 or 4 Saturdays a year to work out back with guys accepting and moving donations with women working inside by cashiering, bagging and upkeep of the sales floor. We've also always had members who volunteer weekly on other

So now our 2nd work day for this year is coming up on Saturday, July 21. We will have 2 shifts as usual. We'll need guys from 8am to noon and both guys and gals from noon to 4pm. This is a great "hands on" mission, so please consider helping out. The signup sheet will be in the office or see Verna 876-1392.

"Snack Packs for Back Packs" BANKS

When Cooper School first opened 10 years ago, only 40 students were eligible for the "Snack Pack for Back Pack" program. Due to changes in demographics and school boundaries, Cooper School now provides 140+ students with these much needed hunger packs each Friday.

FUMCBV has again been asked to be a part of this very necessary program, in the 2018-19 school year. We'll be responsible for 20 students each week. Other churches and the Samaritan Center in Rogers are picking up the balance of the students in need. You'll notice the "goat banks" are out full time -one in the hallway across from the Library and one in the west hallway by the entrance to Becker Hall. The Mission Team's focus is on raising funds now so that each month after school begins, our goal will be met. We estimate that it will take approximately \$150-\$200 per month to pack 80 healthy food bags. This last year we collected lots of quarters ~ and



folding quarters!!! You also can write a check (put "Snack-Pack" in the memo) or pay on Sunday with your credit/debit card. Most months we met our goal, but still more is needed and will be, especially after school begins again in August.

Dudley Buck was the first honorary president of the American Guild of Organists in 1896, and this is his most famous composition.
