REMEMBERING

Karla, Andrew, and I are now preparing for a challenging life in Pine Bluff. We are excited about the possibility the future holds, but we are also anxious about leaving behind so many faithful friends. Saying goodbye is one of the most difficult things any of us has to do. Yet, as I have been packing boxes in preparation for our move, I have discovered reminders of ministry in previous appointments: photographs, letters, bulletins and bits of paper. They have been my consolation. They have taught me again that even when we move on, we carry pieces of our past with us, just as surely as we leave pieces of ourselves behind. As long as we remember, our relationships live on. Perhaps, one of my favorite authors stated it aptly:

When you remember me, it means that you have carried something of who I am with you, that I have left some mark of who I am on who you are. It means that you can summon me back to your mind even though countless years and miles may stand between us. It means that if we meet again, you will know me. It means that even after I die, you can still see my face and hear my voice and speak to me in your heart. (Frederick Buechner, Whistling in the Dark.)

I suppose that the need to remember and to be remembered is one of those things that makes us most human. I suppose that it is also one of the things that draws us closest to one another and to God. God set a rainbow in the clouds to help us and to help God remember the covenant between us. Joshua called his people to set stones from the middle of the Jordan River along its banks that they might remember God's deliverance. The thief who died on the cross beside Jesus pled, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." Even Jesus himself, on the night in which he gave up his life, gathered with his closest friends and asked that every time they shared a meal they remember Him.

Our family thanks you for the memories you have created and shared with us. You have helped us raise our son to be a fine young man, been guests in our home, and supported us with prayer during the time of my sister's death. We will remember fondly the Block Parties, Trunk or Treat, and other community events that we have sponsored together, as well as the times we have shared in Bible studies, Shepherd Groups, Bazaars, and Pancake Days. We will remember the births and baptisms that we have shared, the families that have been created in weddings we've celebrated, the loved ones whose funerals we have attended, and most of all the communion we have shared in worship from week to week.

We thank you for the memories. Although it is painful to accept the fact that from now on we will never again be your pastoral family, we take comfort in remembering, especially remembering that we will always be your friends.

DISCIPLE BIBLE STUDY

CONFIRMATION CLASS 2009

The First United Methodist Church's Confirmation Class 2009 is a class to remember for a variety of reasons. Declared the first confirmation class the church has had, this testifies to the growth of Bella Vista as a community and within our broader church.

Participants were teens from twelve to seventeen years of age who through the course work of the Claim the Name curriculum, weekly meetings with appointed mentors and regular meetings with their parents have been educated to understand the commitment and promise they made when they chose to be confirmed as members of the Methodist Church.



Memorable moments included, a visit from Susan Ledbetter who discussed with the teens "Jesus Christ- Our Savior & Lord" with the talking point "Making the Decision." Rod Alford led the teens through a quantity of information about what it means to "Live Our Faith." A dynamic history lesson given by Jean Justice helped the teens to understand their place in their families through a Family Tree and our place as Christians through the Christian Denomination Family Tree.

All the work culminated in a remarkable trip to see "Noah, the musical" in Branson, MO. The teens declared their gratitude when they discovered the trip was made possible by two generous anonymous donors.

Confirmation Class 2009 welcomed Rod Hocott as guest Pastor on May 31 for a special service. This service proclaimed the class officially complete. The decision to Claim the Name will remain with each individual teen. It is in Jesus Christ's name we pray, that all will be moved by the Holy Spirit to join us as confirmed Christians.



FINANCIAL REPORT

The Endowment Fund of the First United Methodist Church of Bella Vista was formed by action of the Charge Conference on December 2, 1991. Contributions have elevated the fund's book value to \$616,555.07 as of the end of 2008. The available income that can be used for church needs is \$89,874.29.

These funds can be used for these stated purposes: "to assist in the maintenance, welfare and improvement of buildings and property of a capital nature, to assist the local church with consideration towards new and/or exploratory ministries."

In 2009, the fund has contributed \$33,800 to projects such as replacing air conditioners,

helping pave the parking lot, purchasing two humidifiers to protect the piano and organ. In total \$53,731 has been contributed.

There are many reasons that people have contributed to the Endowment Fund, and there is not a limit (small or large) to the contributions that can be made to the fund. Many contributions are made in celebration of a wedding anniversary, to honor the memory of a loved one, or in celebration of a birthday.
