### FAITH WALK

#### From a child's hand to God's heart!

I found an empty envelope on my desk keyboard. It had the words "To: God" and "From: . . . " with a name written on the front. It was clearly the handwriting of a child and the name of the child had been printed by a parent. The small envelope had been placed in the

offering plate on Sunday and inside it contained \$ 1.73. The persons who count the offering had found it and wanted me to see it. It is amazing how a few scribbles that read "To: God" written by a child get your attention. To



some, the amount was small, but to God the \$1.73 is huge! The offering was given out of the purity of a child's faith. Matthew 18:3 says.... "And he said: 'Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven".

Faith is the essence of the Christian life. Faith is emphasized throughout scripture and is presented as an absolute necessity. In fact, "without faith, it is impossible to please God" (Hebrews 11:6). The entire chapter of Hebrews 11 is about faith and those who possessed it. Faith is a gift from God, as we see in Ephesians 2:8-9, and not something we come up with on our own. All Christians have received the gift of faith from God, and faith is part of the armor of God—the shield with which we protect ourselves (Ephesians 6:16).

The Bible never teaches us to have "childlike" faith, at least not in so many words. Jesus says that we must "become as little children" in order to enter the kingdom of God. The context of Jesus' statement is the disciples' question, "Who, then, is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" (verse 1). In response, Jesus "called a little child to him, and placed the child among them. And he said: 'Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Therefore, whoever takes the lowly position of this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. And whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me" (verses 2–5). Jesus promoted a humble, honest faith in God, and He used the innocence of a child as an example. We are called to have the faith of child and trust God completely. When each of us does this personally, we are changed. When we do this as a church, we are changed.

#### You CAN Make A Difference!!!!!!

I often wonder if we are doing our best to welcome persons to worship and to events at First United Methodist Church. I have feedback that we do a good job with some people and not such a great job for other people. We must continuingly strive to do our best at all times no matter whether it is Sunday morning worship, a UMW meeting, Pancake Breakfast, Funeral, etc. Here are some ways you can help welcome people to First United Methodist Church, both guest and members! It takes us all to help to welcome people and help people to feel at home at FUMCBV! (Clip this out and keep it handy to review!)

- ⇒ **Thank you for being here.**" It's just that basic. I have heard from numerous church guests who returned because they were simply told "thank you."
- ⇒ "Let me help you with that." If you see someone struggling with umbrellas, young children, diaper bags, purses, and other items, a gesture to hold something for them is a huge positive. Of course, this comment is appropriate for member-to-member as well.
- ⇒ "Please take my seat." It is a incredible welcoming gesture to offer your seat to someone else.
- ⇒ "Here is my email address or phone number. Please let me know if I can help in any way." Of course, this comment must be used with discretion, but it can be a hugely positive message to a guest.
- ⇒ "Can I show you where you need to go?" Guests do not know where to find the nursery, restrooms, and small group meeting areas, and members do not either, sometimes. You can usually tell when a guest does not know where he or she is to go by the look on their face.

- ⇒ "Let me introduce you to \_\_\_\_\_." The return rate of guests is always higher if they meet other people. A church member may have the opportunity to introduce the guest to the pastor, other church staff, and other members of the church.
- ⇒ "Would you join us for breakfast or lunch?" I saved this question for last for two reasons. First, the situation must obviously be appropriate before you offer the invitation. Second, this approach has the highest guest return rate of any one factor. What if our church members sought to invite different guests 6 to 12 times a year? The burden would not be great; but the impact would be huge.

Welcome Associate Pastor Judy Rudd Platt!





It's that time of year again! Disciple Bible Study groups will be forming and plans are being made to invite new participants to the program.

Disciple Bible Study is an opportunity to begin, or renew, your study of our Christian scripture. It is a series of sequential studies of the Bible and begins with an overview of the Old and New Testaments and ends with a study of Revelation. This series takes four years to complete, but leaves you with a new and exciting understanding of what the Holy Scripture holds for you as an individual.

For the 2015-2016 year, there are many opportunities for you to take part. A *Disciple 1* class will be available for those who are interested. This class is the foundation for all of the other Disciple classes, as it provides each learner with a sound knowledge of the Old and New Testaments – the basis for the other three studies. This class must be taken before you can enroll in any of the other Disciple classes. The day and time for this class is yet to be determined.


The second opportunity for study is for those who have completed *Disciple 3* and would like to continue their studies. A *Disciple 4* class will be offered on Wednesday mornings from 8:30 to 11:00. *Disciple 4* is a sixteen week study of the Old Testament Writings and a sixteen week study of New Testament Writings, including the book of Revelation. There are two other programs that extend the study; *Jesus in the Gospels* and *The Christian Believer*, which was started this year.

For those of you who are interested in beginning or continuing *Disciple Bible Study*, contact Alan Packard (426-6211) for more specific information. There will also be a sign up sheet in the office.

Other opportunities are available if there is enough interest. Evening class are always available – the only requirement is that we need to secure a group of at least six people to participate.



For the last nine months eighteen members of the congregation have spent 30 to 60 minutes each day reading assignments in their Bibles and two hours each week in class seeking to improve their knowledge of the Bible and move forward on their faith journeys.



The founder of Methodism, John Wesley was a firm proponent of daily Bible study, rising early each day to spend time in Bible reading and

prayer. He encouraged all of his followers to take up this practice also. This past year, three classes met and followed the course work to complete *Disciple 1, Disciple 3*, and *Jesus in the Gospels*.

Those who completed Disciple 1 - an overall view or introductory course in the Old and New Testaments included: Maryann Johnson, Mary Johnson, Judy Knadle and Karen Roenfeld. After 36 weeks of this course, the group is determined to continue on into *Disciple 2* next year.

The *Disciple 3* class members, who had already completed *Disciple 1 & 2*, included Juanita Dittmer, JoAnn Handel, Bob McBride, Jeneda Mickelson and Judie Packard. This class spent sixteen weeks studying the Prophets of the Old Testament and sixteen weeks studying the letters of Paul in the New Testament. They, too, have decided to continue their study next year with the final study - *Disciple 4*.

A group of persons who had completed all four of the Disciple Bible Study classes was asked if they would be interested in continuing their Bible Study and eight were able to continue with the study of Jesus in the Gospels. This study focused entirely on Jesus' ministry and teaching as discussed in the four Gospels; Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. The reading was more intense, the discussion more lively and I found this to be one of the best classes in which I have ever been involved. Those who took part in this study included: Mabel Ashline, Darrell and Verna Bottjen, Barbara Brooks, Chet and Cheryl Campbell, Sandy Fitch, Shirley Kennedy, Jackie Stephens and Alan Packard. We have talked about, but made no decision on studying The Christian Believer next year.

As you can see, a number of members of our congregation have taken the time to improve their knowledge of the Bible, our history, and our heritage, and in becoming better informed will become more deeply involved in their Christian faith. Everyone's faith journey involves many steps and often the steps take many week, months, years and even decades. Where are you in your faith journey?


