worry or fear. I would tag along with my uncle to shoot guns out on the prairie or walk uptown to the post office. I could spend hours sitting on the front porch swing with my aunt, speaking to every person who passed. It was a sleepy little town except every June when the county celebrated the Bradley County Pink Tomato festival.

The thing I hated most about visiting my grandmother, aunt and uncle in Warren was piling in the car on Sunday afternoon and driving away. My spirits began sinking on Sunday morning as I gathered my things. When the dreaded time of departure arrived and we exchanged hugs in front of the house, I held on tighter and longer, hoping that somehow there would be a change of events and we could stay longer. We never did. When the time came to pull away, I tried to hide the tears that had begun to overflow my eyes. I hated leaving the place that held such a deep sense of comfort and peace for me.

Leaving my church family here in Bella Vista holds similar feelings of anxiety and sadness. I pondered the ease of being swept away in a whirlwind like Elijah, but I realized that an abrupt departure would deprive us both of the opportunity to tell you how much you have meant to me. From the day I arrived on July 5, 2015, you have loved and supported me in living into my call as an Elder in the United Methodist Church. You have encouraged me in my gifts for ministry and have extended grace in my challenges. You have loved, comforted and reassured me as I have grown in Christ and grown as your pastor. You have blessed me in more ways than I can ever express. (Okay, you have also exasperated me at times too, as I'm sure I have you!) But as I have traveled a journey of heart-wrenching sorrow and upheaval over the last several months, your prayers and words of encouragement have given me strength and hope.

Here are some of the cards that I have received over my time with you here at First United Methodist Church of Bella Vista. They are cards of welcome, thank you, congratulations, encouragement and celebration. They are a reflection of the love I have received while serving among you. ### Tradition – a Firm Foundation for the Future

So, friends, take a firm stand, feet on the ground and head high. Keep a tight grip on the traditions you were taught, whether in personal conversation or by our letter. May Jesus himself and God our Father, who reached out in love and surprised you with gifts of unending help and confidence, put a fresh heart in you, invigorate your work, enliven your speech.

2 Thessalonians 2:15-17 The Message

My husband, Bob, and I recently travelled to Guatemala and found ourselves immersed in the Mayan culture there, a culture that extends back many centuries before Christ and reached its height in the years 300-900 after Christ. This society had a rich tradition which included a fully developed written numbering system (including a symbol for zero), a written language with phonetic symbols in hieroglyphs, and a creation story and resurrection story much like the ones we know from our tradition. We also learned about the current Mayan culture, which consists of a historically agricultural society of folks working to improve their station in life and putting their emphasis on hard work and education to better their society. The people are gracious to outsiders and full of hope for the future.

It only takes a fresh perspective like this to help one to reflect on our own society and on its strengths. John Wesley, the founder of our Methodist approach to faith, saw the development of faith as an interaction between four components: Scripture, Tradition, Reason, and Experience. He had a very practical outlook on how we as human beings come to understand our God. Scripture and the tradition of our faith are the foundations on which we stand; these shape who we are and where we come from. It provides the rock on which we move into the future. As the scripture says, it "helps us take a firm stand with feet on the ground and head high." It "puts a fresh heart in you, invigorates your work, and enlivens your speech."

There is no more important time to realize this than during times of transition. We see a lot of transition in June. When a person graduates from high school or college, when a couple marries, when a new baby is born, when a new job is begun; these are times when one reflects on where they have come from (their past traditions) and where they are being called to for the future.

We as Methodists have a rich tradition filled with love, mercy, and grace. We have a tradition that builds churches from the gifts of the clergy combined with the gifts of laity; we are all in ministry together. We have a tradition that brings in a new pastor more regularly that in other denominations; brings in a new pastor with typically a different set of gifts and graces, with new ideas and another perspective that brings new life and hope for the future. We must step out of our comfort zones to do this, but in doing so, new opportunities abound and new growth flourishes.

In this coming month of June, as we bid "Aloha - Goodbye" to two of our current pastors, Bro. Jaimie and Pastor Judy, and bid "Aloha - Welcome" to our new pastor, Rev. Jeanne, may we reflect on our strong foundation of the past and look with the excitement of a fresh heart toward our future. In this, be prepared for the surprising gifts that God will supply in unending measure! May we all join in the journey together as we move forward with hope and promise of the church we are being called to become.

Our program is designed to maximize the abilities of each participant. We provide the comforts of home with assistance in ADLs (activities of daily living). Village House is a Dementia Care Center with a Certifi-ed Dementia Practitioner, Certifi-ed Nurse Assistants (CNAs), and Life Enrichment Professionals. Village House provides smaller 'ratio care' (5 to 1) than required by the State (8 to 1).

### "Snack Packs for Back Packs" BANKS

When Cooper School first opened 10 years ago, only 40 students were eligible for the "Snack Pack for Back Pack" program. This program provides healthy, easy to prepare foods for school age children over the weekend. The school counselor places a "snack pack" of eight to ten items into the student's back pack on Friday afternoon so the child has food over the weekend.

Due to changes in demographics and school boundaries, Cooper School provides 140 + students with these much needed hunger packs each Friday.

FUMCBV has been asked to be a part of this very necessary program beginning with the 2017-18 school year. We'll be responsible for 40 students each week. Other churches and the Samaritan Center in Rogers are picking up the balance of the students in need. We've done the math. We've prayed. We've conferenced. And we feel this is a project that we are being called to do.

You'll notice the "goat banks" are out full time one in the hallway across from the Library and one in the west hallway by the entrance to Becker Hall. The Mission Team's focus is on beginning to raise funds now. We estimate that it will take approximately \$300 per month (1200 quarters!) to pack 160 healthy food bags. This last month we collected lots of quarters ~ keep up the good work!!! But still more are needed and will be, especially after school begins in August.

Several of the compositions are by Samuel Wesley, son of Charles and nephew of John. In his day, he was known as the English Mozart. Who knew? For the month of June, I'll play some Wesley and works of his contemporaries.
