## Knights of the North Castle VBS

On June 27 thru July 1 we will be offering a One-Room VBS program from 5:30-8:00 PM for children Pre-K (age 4) – rising 6<sup>th</sup> grade. Nursery care will not be available. Weather permitting, we will hold VBS outdoors. Rain location: Becker Hall.

North Castle is hidden in a frozen land. The King's valiant Knights are on a quest in search of the King's Armor. But the armor isn't what they think it is. Knights of the North Castle: Quest for the King's Armor invites children to be strong in the Lord and in the strength of God's

power! Kids will take on the role of brave Knights and begin their quest each session by opening the King's Book. They'll explore Old and New Testament stories and discover different pieces of protective armor – the Belt of Truth, the Breastplate of Justice, the Shoes of Peace, the Shield of Faith, and the Helmet of Salvation – at work in the lives of familiar Bible characters, and explore how that armor works in their own faith lives as they follow and serve God.

Our Quest for the King's Armor is based on Ephesians 6:10-20. Paul wrote a letter from prison. He sent it to some of the followers of Jesus. Paraphrased, he said this, "Be strong because God is always with you. Like soldiers wear armor and carry shields to keep safe, we can wear the armor of God. It's not real armor, but it can help us face hard things. When we speak with truth, stand up for justice, and spread the good news, we are wearing the armor of God. When we have faith, it's like we are carrying the shield of God. When we follow Jesus and the Holy Spirit, it's like we are wearing a helmet. Say prayers all the time.

Keep showing up as faithful followers of Jesus. Pray for each other, and pray for me."

## The Ministry of Caring

And again Jesus said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." And Jesus replied, "Tend my sheep."

(John 21:16 NRSV)

Jesus was a healer. In compassion, he took care of those in need. As he spoke to Simon Peter in those last days, he commissioned Peter to carry on that ministry of caring. We consider Peter as the Rock of the church and the ministry of caring is a crucial part of what binds the church and all people together. There are those within a community of faith who have a heart for God's people. It is rooted in their strong heart for the Lord. Caring of this type is more than giving a ride, taking a meal, sending a card. It involves creating a relationship of trust, compassion, and encouragement with another. In our broken world, this caring involves joining in the journey with another, regardless of the type of journey. Through this relationship of trust and compassion on the shared journey, space is made for God to be present. And when we make space for God, God always shows up. God provides the healing and restoration of spirit and relationship which we all seek, which we all <u>need</u>, to heal our brokenness. Caring such as this has no agenda but to share the Good News of the love of Christ in the lives of others.

More than four years ago, we began a Congregational Care Ministry (CCM) here at FUMCBV. The CCMs are a team of laity who work in partnership with the pastors as a part of the church's ministry of care for those in the church family. During the isolation of the pandemic, more and more folks have needed to experience the love of Christ extended to them by another caring human being. Folks in our community and around the world have grown more lonely, more isolated, more stressed, and more anxious over the past year plus of the pandemic. Our team of CCMs has provided faithful care during this and continues to do so.

We are excited to announce that this coming summer, we will host a Caring Congregation seminar which will train and equip those with the gifts and graces to be CCMs. This training will be held the weekend of August 27-28. It will be led by the Rev. Karen Lampe, the author, developer and implementor of this highly successful ministry at the Church of the Resurrection in Kansas City. During the training, new CCM's grow in ways of understating the 1) theology of care, 2) listening, 3) prayer, 4) boundaries, and 5) visitation. They grow spiritually and relationally as well. This seminar will not only allow us to add to our team, but we will be inviting other churches in our Arkansas UM Conference to join us, as well. Opening the seminar statewide will spread this caring ministry to churches big and small in Arkansas.

If this sounds like the ministry that God has gifted you to do, I invite you to come talk to me about the qualifications to become a CCM and the expectations once you become one. God calls each of us into

ministry, laity and pastors; God may be calling you to this. I pray those who are feeling a nudge to this type of a call to prayerfully consider joining us in the journey of this caring ministry.

May God's blessings be on those who are called to serve in this way and on those who will be served as a result,

Sit a moment and reflect on the question that pastor Brenda asks each Congregational Care Minister each month. The question is not; Are you happy? Are you ok? Are you well? Are you stress

A study for anyone and everyone – *The Cross and the Lynching Tree* "The cross and the lynching tree are the two most emotionally charged symbols in the history of the African American community. James H. Cone explores these symbols and interconnection in the history and souls of black folk. They both represent the worst in human beings and at the same time a thirst for life that refused to let the worst determine our final meaning." Liz Emis has worshiped in the Methodist tradition since 2011, officially joined the Methodist church in 2017, and has attended First United Methodist Church Downtown Bentonville since 2019. She experiences the Divine both within her, in the relationships she cultivates, and in experiencing ways to foster new relationships between other people. She facilitates children's ministry classes for kids ages 0-9, experiencing children as uniquely crafted humans with voices, insights, and spiritual connections containing all they need to thrive. Her role, she says, is to encourage that divine recognition and ensure as few veils as possible are placed between the child and their evolving relationship with God. She sits on her church's mission committee, establishing HomeGrown, a foodrelated relationship program between FUMC and Havenwood Women's Center to promote cross-experiential relationship and connection between both locations' people, child and adult. Most recently, the women and children of Havenwood planted a fruit and vegetable garden on site with the help of their new friends at FUMC. . She holds a BA in Print Journalism and Government and Politics from the University of Maryland, College Park, and has begun the process of discernment toward studying to become a Deacon focused on children's ministry. She facilitates an adult faith study group
