
#### Texas youth invade NWA



There is no charge for the work or materials. The youth do this because they love you through Christ and know that as Christians, we are called to help each other. Each youth and adult pay to come on this mission trip.

## Living a Healthy Lifestyle with Chronic Illness

A workshop on living with Chronic Illness will be offered this September on Tuesdays for six weeks from September 11 through October 16. The 2-1/2 hour sessions are tentatively scheduled from 2pm till 4:30pm.

The workshop, developed at Stanford University, and recommended by both the national Arthritis and the Diabetes Foundations, will be presented at our church through the benevolence of Mercy Health Systems. Kandi Mount, Deaconess in the Arkansas Conference, along with Mercy Chaplain, Steve Dykes, will co-lead this workshop intended for both caregivers and people with chronic health issues. ## Volunteer Wellness Coordinator Position

By next month, we should be ready to offer another category of Visitation Volunteer, which falls under the Congregational Care Ministry. We are seeking members who have nursing, hospice, and/or social work backgrounds. They can be active or retired. It also takes a person who is caring, patient, and a good listener. The volunteers will agree to meet with our members in their home or at the hospital or rehab facility. They will be available to help people as they prepare for a hospital stay or change in routine because of medical concerns. They will also be there to help people transition back into their homes by providing clarification about doctor's orders, assist with new medicine regimes or special self care regarding bandages, exercises, etc. We are looking forward to providing this service to our church members.



#### **PRAYER**

Please Read: Psalm 119:1-176

I will never forget your commandments, for by them you give me life. [Psalm 119:93]

In a Bible Study Group, one day we were supposed to read Psalm 119. I'll never forget the day we were supposed to read it. As we opened our Bibles, we looked at each other with raised eyebrows. Were we really going to read all 176 verses of this psalm, the longest in the Psalter? Yes, indeed, we were. So, for about fifteen minutes, we read Psalm 119 aloud, with each person reading a verse as we went around the circle. When we finished, we felt victorious, as if we had climbed a mountain of Scripture.

If you read all of Psalm 119, especially if you take the time to read it out loud, you'll quickly notice a fair amount of repetition. This psalm makes one basic point, again and again and again. In fact, the structure of Psalm 119 is meant to convey a sense of thoroughness and completeness in making this point. It is an acrostic psalm, with twenty-two stanzas that begin with each letter of the Hebrew alphabet, in order.

Psalm 119 pulls out all the stops in celebrating

Psalm 119 pulls out all the stops in celebrating God's truth. His Word not only guides our steps and keeps us from getting off course, but also, in a phrase, it gives us life.

Why do we read, study, reflect upon, and pray the Scriptures? Because in them we find life; life with meaning and purpose, life with depth and truth, life both now and forever. The Word of God guides us so that we might live life to the fullest. It shows us how to find significance in every aspect of life as we live for God and his glory.

**PRAYER:** Gracious God, how I thank you for your written Word. Indeed, as the psalmist says, your commandments have given me life. Thank you for showing me how to live with meaning each day as I see my life connected to your grand work in the world. Thank you for teaching me through Scripture how to be faithful in my workplace, my family, my church, and my community. Thank you for showing me how I can live, not in my own strength, but by your power. How grateful I am for biblical teaching on the Holy Spirit and his gifts. Thank you for revealing the nature and purpose of the church, helping us to be the people of God, a body consistently growing in you as each part is active. Thank you for showing us in Scripture that we are called into your mission, and that we can live out this mission each day in every area of life.

Finally, thank you for revealing in the Bible your love for me, your grace through Christ, and your invitation to live in relationship with you.

All praise be to you, O God, for your Word gives me life! *Amen.*


# Shepherd Group Leader Annual Meeting and Appreciation Luncheon. . . .

Whether vou take communion the to homebound, or you are communion serving church, there are particular

ways to dispose of the leftover bread and juice. For sure, we are not to put either in the trash or down the sink. The preferred way is for the bread to be eaten and the juice to be drank—by the clergy person, the ones who clean up after the service, or members of the church. The second preferred way is to break the remaining bread into small pieces and spread upon the ground to be eaten by the birds and the critters. The juice should be poured on the ground where it can become a part of the earth again. Hosts or wafers may be saved to be used first the next time communion is served.

Are you aware that any item that uses batteries as their power source or any item with a plug should NOT go to the landfill? Esco Processing and Recycling will take those items and disassemble them, removing the harmful components for reuse and dispose of the rest responsibly. (See their flyer). The Green Team hopes to do a church wide project to help members dispose of these items in the near future. In the mean time keep items in a box at your house, and not our landfill.

Soon you can watch for a small container in or near the Narthex where you can bring your dead batteries for recycling as well. We are trying to make it as convenient as possible for each of you to dispose of things we each have but in such small quantity we wonder about the significance of our one or two. YOU can make a difference!

On May 5<sup>th</sup> Benton County will again sponsor an event to collect hazardous waste. See POA website and publications for time and place.

#### **VOLUNTEERS IN MISSION**

The United Methodist Church is at the forefront of providing care, sustenance, and nurturing for people in need everywhere in the world. The Arkansas Conference of the United Methodist Church is very active in its Volunteers-In-Mission (VIM) Program providing volunteer teams led by trained individuals anywhere in the state, region, nationally, and internationally whenever a disastrous situation so dictates. Outside of Arkansas, the teams work under the auspices of the United Methodist Commission on Relief (UMCOR). UMCOR is normally one of the first organizations to respond when help for people is needed because of a natural, or man-caused, disaster anywhere in the world.

Putting our faith into action is at the very heart of our Christian calling. The New Testament instructs His followers to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, give shelter to the homeless, heal the sick, care for the widows, and nurture the children. Through VIM, every person in the church has the opportunity to serve and live their lives more faithfully. When you reach out and use what God has given us, you will experience a profound life-transformation.

Bella Vista FUMC has a Volunteer-in-Mission Program and a number of trained VIM leaders. In the past, we have responded to the Hurricane disaster areas in Louisiana and Mississippi and we are ready to respond again when the need arises. Our next "hard" scheduled mission will be in October 2012 to Sager Brown UMCOR Depot in Baldwin, LA.

We realize that not everyone is physically capable of handling the rigors and work demands of some of the mission trips. However, everyone can be of great assistance to the VIM program by providing funds to offset the costs of a trip, which can be extensive. 
