FUMCBV Youth Life T-Shirts: Youth Life have really nice T-shirts for sale. They are in the office or Youth room, and cost \$20 each.





May MISSION of the MONTH MOUNTAIN of FOOD

The month of May is traditionally the month we build the Mountain of Food as our Mission of the Month. We replenish the food pantries at Helping Hands, Souls Harbor, Care and Share and the Arkansas Rice Deport. This is a slow time of year for donations – but it's one of the busiest times for the pantries.






