

The Growing Ministry of Caring

And again Jesus said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." And Jesus replied, "Tend my sheep." (John 21:16 NRSV)



On April 19-20, six Congregational Care team members travelled together to Kansas City to attend the Congregational Care Ministry Conference at the United Methodist Church of the Resurrection (COR). We made this trip so that the care ministry of our church could grow in ways the Lord is leading us. While there, we were inspired by the approach which COR takes with this ministry and how it is a crucial part of the church DNA. During that time, we grew in ways of understanding of the 1) theology of care, 2) listening, 3) prayer, 4) boundaries, and 5) visitation. We grew spiritually and relationally in our time together.

All Christians, laity and clergy, are in ministry for our Lord, called to use their individual gifts and graces in Christ's ministry of outreaching love. CCM's have a heart for God's people which is rooted in their strong heart for our Lord. Caring, which a CCM shares, is more than giving a ride, taking a meal, sending a card. It involves creating a relationship of trust, compassion, and encouragement with another. Through this relationship together on this shared journey, space is made for God to be present. And when we make space for God, God always shows up providing the healing and restoration of spirit and relationship which we all seek; which we all need to heal our brokenness. CCM's have no agenda but to share the good news of the love of Christ in the lives of others.

We have had a Congregational Care Ministry Team in place since last summer. At any point during the past year our team of four has been in ministry to anywhere from 12-17 individuals or families. We are excited to tell you that we have added **three new Congregational Care Ministers. They are Judy Kaufmann, Pat Fox, and Dave Broers.** They will soon be commissioned in worship. This will give them authority to tend the Lord's sheep in ways that are in partnership with our pastors, Rev. Jeanne and me. We invite you to be present for the commissioning on May 6, and then to share with us any care needs you may have or needs you know others to have. In the hustle and bustle of our lives, we sometimes forget about those not immediately present with us. These folks are the lonely, the least, and the lost. Not being aware of who these folks are prevents our ministry from growing to meet their needs. Please come and join with us by making us aware of those folks, so that we can go out and be fruitfully engaged in the ministry we have been called to grow.


LADIES NIGHT OUT IS HERE AGAIN

May Mission of the Month MOUNTAIN of FOOD

Each year in May, the congregation of First United Methodist Church Bella Vista dedicates our Mission of the Mountain of Food. We

build a mountain of canned goods, rice and other nonperishable food to be given to local food banks. Helping Hands and Care and Share in Gravette, both of whom serve large populations of the hungry in our area, receive a portion of the food we purchase, as well as our food banks in Bella Vista.

The program is easy. You'll find an "order form" in your Sunday bulletin. Listed are all the items you can purchase with your donation. This year, a full order costs \$195.28. You can choose to purchase a full order, just a few items or simply make a donation to the Mountain of Food. We then place an order at our local Harps, based on what we have received through your contributions.

The impact we have had on hunger through our various efforts has been impressive. Unfortunately, the need is still great. One fifth of our neighbors in Northwest Arkansas are still food insecure, meaning that they are unsure at least one day each week where or if they will have food. This is one way we can fulfill our mission to Be the Church – by feeding the hungry as we are called.

And remember – donating to Mission of the Month should be in addition to your regular giving to the church.


