However, everyone can be of great assistance to the VIM program by providing funds to offset the costs of a trip, which can be extensive. The planned trip to Sager-Brown will cost each individual \$205, not including travel costs, and all expect to pay that; however, donations received to offset those costs would be greatly appreciated.
