Joining in the Journey Together

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven." (Ecclesiastes. 3:1)



As the temperatures begin to drop, pancake and arts and craft times arrive, and the leaves take on the colors of Fall, it is hard not to think of the scripture of Ecclesiastes 3:1.

Ecclesiastes is historically thought to be written by King Solomon, the "Wisest Man Who Ever Lived." He seems to be looking back over his life, trying to find godly wisdom in his journey, so that he can pass it on to his readers, to us.

I love the cool, crisp days of Fall, the awesomely blue sky, the truly white, wind-swept clouds, and the rainbow of the colors of the leaves. It's a great time to be outside, to take a walk, to breathe in the fresh air, and to be amazed at the beauty all around me. It's football time, and big, puffy chrysanthemum time, and pumpkin time, and harvest time, and a time to give thanks for our blessings. Lots of wonderful things happen in the Fall. And yet, I also feel a tinge of sadness because the days are getting shorter and I know the barrenness of winter is not far off. What wisdom can I gain from Ecclesiastes? "Vanity of vanities," (Eccl 1:2a) The Hebrew word for "vanity" is *hevel*, meaning "breath." Knowing the meaning behind this, as King Solomon meant it, is important for me. Vanity has a totally different meaning today. In Hebrew it means "breath". God's gift of Breath is the gift of Life. The wise message from King Solomon is not to be sad about the passing season or to worry about what lies ahead, but to take joy in the present, breathe the fresh air, live in the moment. Give thanks; it is all a gift from God.

There is a children's book called *The Fall of Freddie the Leaf* by Leo Buscaglia. It is "a story of life for all ages." Freddie, the young, inquiring leaf, is trying to understand what is happening in the Fall. The wise leaf, Daniel, tells Freddie that Fall is a **wonderful** season when all the leaves take on their own special colors. Freddie is worried about what comes after Fall, some of the leaves are dropping. So he goes to Daniel, who tells him "It's time for the leaves to change their home, but that change is a part of Life. Life is about the sun and the moon; about happy times together; about the shade we make in Summer, and about the old people and children who rest in our shade. It's about the colors in Fall. It's about the seasons. Life is bigger than us; Life lasts forever and we are a part of it." So breathe the air of Fall, eat pancakes, go to craft fairs, play golf, watch a football game with your family, carve a pumpkin, sit on the patio, marvel at the Fall colors, spend time with a friend, buy candy, laugh at Trunk or Treat, count the stars. For everything there is a season. It's about Life. It's about God's gift of the journey and the walk with our Lord along the way. Join in; we each have a part in it.

Bazaar Wrap Up




Helping Hands, Inc.

SAGER BROWN TRIP


