


UMC OPPORTUNITIES

Deliveries

A total of 184 shoeboxes, work gloves, children's underwear, socks, cleaning and laundry items. To date 205 shoeboxes have been delivered in September with more to go. This is a very busy times for us and your generous donations of items and time are greatly appreciated.

Shoes

We have received more than 25 pairs of shoes and three pairs of boots. The boots have been given to Seven Hills day shelter. The residents of Soul's Harbor were overjoyed at our generosity of shoes to help them to dress properly for job interviews. They are working hard to improve their lives.

Sunshine Sacks

We have begun the "Sunshine Sack" program this month at Cooper Elementary School. Eligible students are those who qualify for the snack pack program. The number of eligible students has increased by 13 to 60 students from last years beginning total. These sacks are packed each month by the "Sunshine Ladies", as we call the members of Martha Circle, and sent home to students in their back packs.

MISSION of the MONTH HAVENWOOD

Our Vision: Empowering Single Parent Families and transforming lives.



The Havenwood program meets basic needs by providing a safe and secure place to live. We empower families by providing family, group and individual counseling. We connect residents with community support and resources to break down the barriers each family faces in order to move from homelessness to self-sufficiency and transform their family.

Residents receive services including individual case management services, information and referral, parenting education, pre-job guidance, money management, and goal setting. Residents have been assisted with transportation, life skills education, and with personal financial counseling through case management.

Our average length of stay is 6 months before residents can be transitioned into their own housing (apartment, rental home, etc.). Our average resident is a female between 18-35 years of age, leaving an overcrowded or unsafe living environment, with no regular income source at admission or on Temporary Assistance, with one to two children under the age of five.



VOLUNTEERS IN MISSION

Thirteen members of the FUMCBV congregation departed on Saturday, August 24, to travel to UMCOR's Sager Brown Depot in Baldwin, Louisiana.

Sager Brown served a real feast for breakfast and lunch each day. Dinner provided a smaller number of options, but was still very plentiful. Friday night. We thanked Marlene for being our leader and thanked our bus drivers, Ed Fischer, Marlene Clapp, Sue Nebrig and Janet Walton. We closed the evening with prayer by Dick Andersen before we each returned to our homes to rest up. It was a great mission trip. Next year's trip to UMCOR's Sager Brown is scheduled for October 2014.
