Coming Soon: "Graced by the Fruits of Our Labor"

Healing Ministries

Are you hurting? Pray. Do you feel great? Sing. Are you sick? Call the church leaders together to pray and anoint you with oil in the name of the Master. Believing-prayer will heal you, and Jesus will put you on your feet. And if you've sinned, you'll be forgiven—healed inside and out.

James 5:13-15 (MSG)

We live in a broken and hurting world; we hurt physically, mentally, and spiritually. Our world is not unlike the world when Jesus walked the earth with us. Jesus healed the sick and the hurting with prayer and with touch. He sent his disciples out to do likewise. The ritual of anointing was used in their healing ministry. (Mark 6:13)

Recently our Congregational Care Ministers have been offering prayer and anointing at the altar rail on the Sundays of Holy Communion. You may be unfamiliar with this practice or believe that it is not used in the United Methodist Church. You may think that this practice is only used in the Roman Catholic Church. Although this practice is not used in every Christian denomination, our UMC theology does include it. In our UM Book of Worship, liturgy is given for a number of services in a section entitled 'Healing Services and Prayers.' These services include both the practice of anointing and the laying on of hands.

All healing and wholeness is of God. As disciples, we are called to pray with and for each other in all things, but especially in times of challenge and brokenness; times of grief, illness, broken relationships, discouragement, and more. In these prayers, we share the pain and provide an act of hope in God. Those who minister in ways of spiritual healing are channels of God's love. The ministry of touch through laying on of hands and/or anointing enacts the grace of God. The touch bridges alienation, swallows isolation, breaks suffering, and opens discouraged human spirits. The UM Book of Worship notes that 'anointing the forehead with oil is a sign act invoking the healing love of God. The oil points beyond itself and those doing the anointing to the action of the Holy Spirit and the presence of the healing Christ, who is God's Anointed One.' Note that healing in this way is not 'magic', but is a result of the underlying mystery of God's love. In our joining together in Holy Communion, the underlying mystery of God's love through the Holy Spirit calls us and reconciles us in community through Jesus Christ. In the one-on-one act of prayer and anointing, the mystery of God's love through the Holy Spirit reconciles us to God and within ourselves.

When you are so led, we invite you to participate in this healing ministry, to sense the power of the Holy Spirit, to feel the touch of our Lord and Savior, and to remember that God is always with us on the journey, regardless of where we are or what we are going through.



We are officially in our final days of preparing for the 2018 Holiday Bazaar. For at least nine months workers have logged many hours at



physically abused children in a supportive child friendly environment. At the CAC abused children and their families can receive the support needed to deal with the abuse. We are available to serve all Benton County child abuse victims under age 18 after a report has been made to the child abuse hotline.

Services provided are:

- child-friendly and ♦ A non-threatening environment
- Trained forensic interviewers
- Specialized Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner and an on-site medical exam room
- ♦ Child advocates to assess family needs and provide follow-up, support, and referral services
- ♦ On-site counselors available to meet with the child and non-offending family members
- All services at no charge to the family
- child-friendly and ♦ A non-threatening environment

In 2016 the CAC opened 950 cases; conducted 976 forensic interviews; performed 230 forensic medical exams, provided 2,116 counseling sessions to children and their families and facilitated training and education events to 9,213 people.

My work for October re-focuses back on the organ, with two separate themes. For preludes, I'll continue playing arrangements by Dale Wood. For postludes, the theme is combinations! I'm not talking about stop combinations, where you match a principal with flute and strings, but rather like a chicken sandwich, waffle fries, and an unsweetened tea! I can see a few folks who have spotted me at my favorite hangout on West Walnut nodding their heads! In music, this would be like Prelude and Fugue, Toccata and Fugue, and Theme and Variations!

On Sunday, October 27th, the theme will be scary music, just in time for Halloween. The prelude will be on the piano - Gounod's *Funeral March of a Marionette*. For the postlude, was this ever in doubt? Toccata and Fugue in D minor by a pretty famous member of the Bach family.
