A View From the Other Side

I have had the opportunity to take extended leave three times in my career, and every time, I have returned with a different perspective, or view, of the church I'm serving. Of course, this has a lot more to do with me than the church!

Having the ability to step back and look at the big picture is extremely important for leaders in any organization, pastors of churches notwithstanding. We get caught in the mire of the day-to-day operation and we lose the long-term view and goals.

Now, I'm still on leave for another few weeks, but I will begin to be in the office some starting this month. I can honestly say that this leave has been anything but restful! Our lives were completely and totally flipped upside down in the most amazing, glorious ways! But to say I'm coming back refreshed is an understatement.

Despite that, though, I am coming back looking at the big picture, the larger and longer view of what, where, why, and how God is calling our church to make disciples in our community. While we were on leave, Rev. Dr. Michelle Morris came to the first Mid Week Manna to debrief us on our Gospel Discipleship results. We learned that we are a Lukan church, and Pastor Brenda explained a lot of that in her article last month. From these results, we know that we like being together! We like our fellowship times! We like small groups! We like relating to one another! We also learned that it's hard for us to let people go, even when they want to go. We learned that we are susceptible to bullies because of this tendency. We learned that we can be cliquish – too closed in our small groups to allow new people a place. From these learnings, the Discipleship Team is beginning work on creating a Discipleship System to present to the church.

What is a Discipleship System? Well, it's something that organizes our ministry inside and outside of the church walls that encourages us to be better disciples of Jesus Christ and to reach more people in our community who need to hear about God's love. Our goal is to have this system before you early in 2020. We'll be seeking input and thoughts before we reveal it, but hint – look closely at the Stewardship Materials you are receiving! You're going to see that logo again! Let me be clear that this will NOT replace Every One In Ministry! We will still use that system to align our ministry opportunities with those who wish to serve them.

I am grateful for this time I have been given to bond with my new family. It was more needed than we ever could have imagined. I continue to covet your prayers and support as we continue to figure out our new routines and "normal." I also want to say a very giant thank you to all of you who organized and attended the shower held for us. I am steadily working on individual thank you notes, but we did have a few gifts and cards that did not have names attached to them. If you don't receive a note from us, please know this is what happened and we are extremely grateful for your gift. We are completely overwhelmed by our church communities' love and support during this new chapter for us. We are blessed to serve with each of you!



From the Organ Console Broc Hite, Organist/Pianist

Plans gone awry. I had to substitute one of my Vierne pieces on Music Appreciation Sunday because there were too many notes to learn! That's a small



thing. The big decision was to postpone the Mini Hymn Festival that I planned on the Sunday preceding my class in Sacred Music starting on Wednesday, October 16th as part of Midweek Manna. It's tough to plan ahead, especially when you're daring to do big, unfamiliar things. It's sometimes difficult to know how to pull back. I wish I could tell you that my aha moment happened as the result of fervent prayer. In this case, it was just a thought spark while driving that instantly informed what I must do.

If you haven't heard about my Sacred Music class, I'll summarize it here. Believe it or not, Christians didn't sing four-part hymns until fairly recently in music history. The Protestant movement had a big part in that, but that's still centuries after what we're going to cover in this Part One of Paul Westermeyer's book Te Deum. We'll go back to the singing of Psalms, before the common era, and wind up after the time of Charlemagne, well before the 16th Century. If this goes well, there will be a part two, covering the Reformation forward to 20th Century worship - but more on that next year!

If you're more interested in my preludes and postludes, I'm dipping into the music of Felix Mendelssohn to present some movements from his six organ sonatas, as well as some free-standing pieces. Switching to the piano, I'll complete my two-year traversal of Book One of Bach's Well-Tempered Clavier in November. In December, I'm planning two half-recitals, one on organ, one on piano. Perhaps I'll put a full recital together, combining the two, on a Sunday afternoon program! More news about that next month, and on my blog and social media before that!
