PRAYER

A Dear Friend recently suggested that where the Prayer Ministry is concerned, one ought not to have to ask *whether* members wish to serve in the ministry, but *where*. Oh that it were so!

The time is rapidly approaching when we will once again be asked to serve the Lord and our church family in one of our many ministries for the upcoming year. Therefore I am going to describe the functions of each of the Prayer Ministries at FUMC; so that you may (prayerfully) choose where you wish to serve.

The Hedge Prayer Intercessory Ministry purpose is to cover every aspect of each worship with a "hedge" of protection through prayer. The analogy of the "hedge", comes from Job 1:10 where Satan accuses God of placing a hedge around Job, protecting him from Satan's temptations: "Have you not put a fence around him and his house and all that he has, on every side?...".

The area used for this prayer ministry contains materials to assist the volunteers including, scriptural prayer suggestions and a box containing the names of every family/member of our church community. Prayer for as many families/persons as possible is offered each week, on a rotation basis, from A to Z and back to A and so forth, again and again. Using this method, our entire congregation is being prayed for on Sunday mornings many times a year.

The second area of this ministry, new in 2012, consists of members who volunteer to pray as they walk through the Sanctuary and Becker Hall over the pews or chairs for the people who will be sitting there, like-wise the lectern, choir loft, pulpit, etc. This "walk" will be performed prior to each service in the appropriate location.

You will not be asked to sacrifice your opportunity to attend worship to be a part of this essential ministry; but to serve in an hour when you do not ordinarily attend service.

The Sanctuary Intercessory Ministry, differs

from all the other prayer ministries as the principal purpose is to pray for requests made on the pew cards which are designated for eyes and prayers of pastors and this very special group of pray-ers only, who covenant to come at least once during the week to pray in the Sanctuary, before the Holy Altar, for these confidential requests, which they further covenant to keep private.

They will of course, pray for the other requests made on the pew cards, and requests from prayer lists provided to them from other prayer ministries as well.

A book containing all requests is available only to members of the Sanctuary Intercessory group. A sign up sheet is provided where members record their visits to the sanctuary for prayer. Included in the prayer book, is material to assist in effective prayer.

Both of the above ministries are in dire need of volunteers to give the best covering of prayer this congregation can offer. What a shame it will be if we are unable to fulfill our commitment to God and this congregation for lack of pray-ers.

The Lord has said, "My house shall be a house of prayer". The Hedge Intercessory Prayer Ministry, The Sanctuary Intercessory Ministry and the other Intercessory Prayer Ministries, certainly do everything we can to accomplish what He has asked of us. Remembering that the foundation of all ministries, the health and success of our church community, and all that transpires with-in the walls of this place we call our Church Home is dependant upon the prayers of faithful believers, I beg you, (yes, I'm begging) please prayerfully seek the Lord for direction in where you will serve in the Prayer Ministry of FUMC, we need you, . . . and you, . . . yes, and you.

Finding ways to be better stewards of all of our resources

Suggestions at Home:

Clean or replace air filters monthly. The inexpensive pleated filters (not fiberglass) at WalMart are fine. This can save 15% of your energy usage.

Clean a closet and donate unwanted items to Helping Hands.

Give gifts that the recipient will use up: food, gift certificates, plants, etc.

Consider native plants for your garden.

Obey the speed limit when driving. Every 10 mph faster reduces fuel economy by about 4 mpg regardless of vehicle size.

Suggestions at Church:

Participate in the "Adoption Program" by providing the funds to purchase a needed item.

Elect to receive your monthly newsletter by email rather than by mail. Save paper, copying & postage costs.

If you open a window while at church, make sure you close it securely before you leave.

TURN OFF THE LIGHTS when you leave a room!

The Green Church Project for thermostats and motion sensors was quite successful. The response was overwhelming. In about a week and a half seven thermostats and six sensors were adopted. Thanks to Sue Nebrig, Pat Mayer, Charlie and Marion Korns, Janet Walton, Keith and Co Ellen Sterwald, Janice Smith, Steve Larsen, Bette and Earl Cummings, Martha Grant, and Richard Anderson for participating in this adoption project.

The whole purpose of this project is to conserve energy and reduce cost to the church. Thanks to Keith Sterwald for diligently monitoring and programming the thermostats we had and for installing the new ones. He is refiguring the way some of the pumps are being utilized, making them more efficient, and getting the church more comfortable temperature wise. This being said, there will be instructional signs going up by the thermostats.

Do not change the settings more than two (2) degrees up or down. Do not press the "Hold" button. Do not open the doors on any of the thermostats. Keith will get the schedule for meetings from the church secretary, Janet Walton, and will program the thermostats for those meetings. When you contact Janet to schedule a special meeting, she will let Keith know so that settings can be programmed.
