Do Not Be Afraid

Recently, I was on my morning walk home from several laps around the Elm Springs cemetery when I had a reason to be *very* afraid. As I walked past one of the homes, a new

large Labrador retriever came charging across the front yard at me. The 80+ pound dog ignored the adamant commands to "stop" and "come" screamed by the owner from the front porch. Years of hiking in bear country conditioned me for this moment. I turned to face the dog and planted my feet firmly – to retreat at that moment would have insured certain attack. As I stood my ground, awaiting the impact, the dog attempted to stop and slid on the pavement beside me as it hurried to gather itself and reposition for an encounter. Although it snapped at my hand, I was able to avoid contact. Thankfully, the owner gained the dog's attention, and the dog slinked back into its yard acknowledging its willful disobedience. I accepted the owner's sincere apologies as I turned to walk home in gratitude that the only evidence of the encounter was my heart pounding furiously in my chest.

Prior to my "near miss" with the neighbor's dog, I awakened most mornings yearning for the quiet time on my walk, looking for evidence of the baby bunnies, and communing with God in prayer. I expectantly anticipated receiving the gift of my Creator's Presence and the divine wisdom and assurances that only my Beloved gives to me. But things changed that fateful morning. I became reluctant to take my morning walk. Since alternative routes are not an option on the narrow county roads of Elm Springs, I began carrying pepper spray to protect myself. Every morning that I walk to the cemetery, I face my fear of reliving that fateful morning with the possibility of a more gruesome outcome. I have seen the dog unattended several times in the neighbor's backyard, but it has always been chained to a tree.

I don't like change. I don't like living in fear, either. Benjamin Franklin once said that "In this world, nothing is certain except death and taxes." In other words, Ben was stating that change is inevitable. Around 500 BCE, a Greek philosopher by the name of Heraclitis from Ephesus stated it more bluntly, "The only constant is change." Don't you just love philosophers!

Whether we like it or not, change happens. We have a choice about how we respond. We can resist it and be miserable; or we can embrace it and grow. It is simple to say, but often hard to do. Paul reminds us in 2 Timothy 1:7, "For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline." When we fear change, we are not living as God intended.

Fear provides an opportunity for prayer. Below is the prayer that I shared in the services on August 21st which you might find helpful the next time you find yourself facing fear and change.


Holy, Life-Transforming God,

I want to be more like Jesus. Reveal the obstacles that keep me from seeking and knowing your desire for my life. Show me the places in my life where I am blind and fail to recognize you. Show me the truth about myself. Grant me courage and strength to release all perceptions, attitudes, words and actions that prevent me from being the faithful disciple that you desire for me to be. Help me to say "Yes" to Your Call to transform me.

Journeying Together

Put on then, as God's chosen ones holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, bearing with one another. Colossians 3:12-13a

Support Groups are of God. Paul's words to the first century Christians in the city of Colossae ring as true today as they did then. These early Christians were having struggles in their lives that tested their faith in the love of God through God's Son, Jesus. Paul acknowledged that struggles will happen and said we are called to be like Christ and put on compassionate hearts as we bear with one another. Paul did not say "fix one another"; he said "bear with one another"; join in the journey together.

You may be aware of the Caregiver's Support Group which has been meeting for some time in our church. It was a group formed to bear with one another in the journey of caring for a loved one with dementia or other difficult illness. This group, in the past, was led by John Koonce and met on Monday mornings. When John and Janie moved to Kansas, I was blessed to be asked to continue this support group. As these blessings have unfolded, we have changed up a few things, one of which is a new meeting time and place. Beginning September 20, **the Caregiver's Support Group will meet on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays at 10am, in the Chapel.** We spend some time each meeting sharing coffee and nibbles, sharing helpful information, wisdom, and most of all, sharing compassion, as we journey together in this care-giving to which we have been called. I truly mean we, as I, too, am a caregiver for my mother who moved to Arkansas from Maryland this past May.

On **Tuesday, September 20**, the topic we will share is "Stages of Dementia: How to Know When it is Time." Time, that is, for full-time nursing care and possibly even time for Hospice. On **Tuesday, October 4**, Todd Whatley, an attorney in elder law, will share with us "How to Plan and Protect our Assets for Elder Care." This information can help ensure the expense of elder care does not deplete all of our resources. We invite you to join us.

Also remember that our "When Mourning Dawns: Living Your Way through the Seasons of Your Grief" is a support group for those who are grieving due to losses of any type: death, divorce, health, dreams.... This group meets **Tuesday evenings from 5:30-7pm in the Chapel**.

Paul said, "with compassionate hearts, bear *with* one another". As together we bear with one another, the burden becomes lighter for all. We invite you to join us on either or both of these journeys.


Rummage Sale Success!

As part of a separate August project, I learned and performed three pieces by César Franck, of which the last, the Pièce Héroïque, is on the list. The remaining three pieces, by Bach, Buxtehude, and Hindemith, will be learned and played this month.

I trust that this won't be at all a testing experience for you. You will get a first listen to what might become my program should I go ahead with this project!
