




# Glimpses of Grace

Grace. Grace is perhaps the one thing that defines our denomination from others. Grace that is freely given and received. The United Methodist Church has even defined grace as three different types: prevenient, justifying, and sanctifying. God's grace is what connects us as a church family, as a denomination, and as the body of Christ made of all humanity.

If we are to love others as God loves us, then we have to lead with grace. Grace to cover our own prejudices and judgments and grace to extend love to others.

We're in the midst of a series called The Art of Neighboring. As I have had to reflect on my own feelings of approaching my neighbors and truly begin being in relationship with them, I've had to extend grace. Grace to myself and to them. And it has started me on a journey of, "what would happen if we DID remember that God's grace is for all?" For the person who rear ended me last week; for the person driving 15 mph under the speed limit; for the wreck that causes me to be late to my appointment; for the talking heads on the news; ... for even those inside the church we don't agree with?

Let's be honest. We're people and as people we are imperfect. And our imperfections follow us into the church building, too. And sometimes even inside the church building, we find ourselves judging one another: "I can't believe she's wearing that!" "Is that jacket from 1950?" "How can they let their kids run all over like this?" "Mom's always here, where is dad?" "Goodness. He's gained a lot of weight." And I'm sure you can think of others. Maybe even: "The band is too loud today." "I can't hear the preacher." "This service is going over, again."

So what happens if before we walk into the church building we pause, pray for God's grace to lead us, and smile? Smile because God has forgiven you of your shortcomings and God forgives everyone else, too. Smile because you're here to worship God, and fellowship with other believers. Smile because God loves YOU, so how could you not smile? Smile because you realize that to be a good neighbor means to love even the people who annoy you the most across the aisle.

Friends, it is impossible to start a neighboring movement if we don't first recognize that we have to be good neighbors inside our own building. Perhaps, if you disagree with someone, you should handle it the way the Bible instructs us: confront that person with love and honor and with the assistance of a neutral party if needed. When there is division within the church walls, we will never fulfill God's mission of making disciples of Jesus Christ in our community. And goodness, when you really think about it, what can be so monumental to overcome that we miss the opportunity God is calling us to?





## SEPTEMBER MISSION of the MONTH

Red Bird Mission and Clinic have been providing ministries in this region of the

Appalachian Mountains since 1921. Red Bird Mission and Clinic strives to meet these needs through ministry in five areas: Education, Health and Wellness, Community Outreach, Economic Opportunity, and Community Housing Improvement.

The Education ministries are carried out through a K-12 school and an early childhood development program for 3 and 4 year-old children. These education ministries provide the opportunity for the children and youth of this community to get a quality education in a loving Christian environment empowering these young people with tools that will help them escape this cycle of poverty in which they are exposed to and live in daily.

Health and Wellness ministries are provided through medical and dental clinics providing quality health and dental care in an area that is chronically underserved. In addition to in-Clinic visits, our providers travel to the homes of our patients to provide care to those that are homebound.

The other three areas of ministries provide a wide variety of services to the residents of this area. Volunteers in mission service come and help with the refurbishment of homes, low-cost clothing and furniture is provided through the community store and local crafter's wares are marketed to a wide area through the craft marketing ministry. A wide variety of ministries to families, older adults, women and children, and youth make their lives fuller and help them receive the assistance they need to make their lives a bit more livable.

Support for these ministries come from churches and individuals across the nation. Over the years the Mission has enjoyed wide support in The United Methodist Church as well as from other denominations. Your donations to Red Bird Mission and Clinic will help us continue these vital ministries in this distressed region of Appalachia.


