

What's the (Hi)Story? Jill Hale, FUMC Historian



We hope you had a blessed Easter. It was a very busy time for those involved in music ministry, as I am sure it was for others serving in various ministries in our church. This month, we will recapture some of the events that occurred in 2002.

In regard to our building facility, the following improvements were made:

- A Coke machine was installed in the hallway outside of Becker Hall.
- The steeple was cleaned.
- A new ice machine was purchased.
- The parking lot was resurfaced.
- A refrigerator was added to the Sacristy for use during communion.
- New air conditioning was installed.
- A new church bus was purchased to replace "Old Blue."

In addition to the above items, plans were made for updating the sound system in Becker Hall. The old components were utilized, plus new equipment was added. Dr. Larry Zehring advised the Board of Trustees that the money for the needed changes had been donated.

Work began on a Five-Year Plan to determine the present condition of all church structures, to look into the future and set goals as to where the church should be at the end of the five years, and to determine what physical changes would be necessary. By August, the first report was submitted regarding needed improvements to the facility. These included electrical and general maintenance updates and repairs, for starters.

During the year, the Board of Trustees set a policy that no political meetings would be allowed on the property.

Members and guests were given the opportunity to learn Spanish and to participate in Tai Chi with weekly classes that started in August. Other activities included the annual Easter Egg Hunt in March, the UMM Spring Pancake Feed in May, the Annual Watermelon Feed in August, the Third Annual FUMC Golf Tournament in September, and a Wesley Series piano concert in October. Bill Detlefsen, in his "A History of First United Methodist Church, Bella Vista from 1976 to 2003," listed continuing mission ministries. These included: entering into a "Covenant Relationship" with Rev. Daniel Godwin and his family, who were serving in Ecuador; continuing "Financial Commitment Covenants" with the Whitfields in Africa and Ramiro Lizcano in Rogers; the Shoebox Ministry, which provided 3,133 shoeboxes "during the past year;" and assisting with the building of a Habitat for Humanity house in Rogers.

This month's installment may be a bit shorter than usual. In June, we will look at one more year provided in the Detlefsen history. After that, we will take a look at the Shoebox Ministry in more depth, and then we will return to congregational stories. PLEASE consider sharing your story with us.
