From Rev. Ron Hayes *“Seeing the Fullness of God’s Creation”*

“All these things are for your benefit. As grace increases to benefit more and more people, it will cause gratitude to increase, which results in God’s glory.” 2 Corinthians 4:15 (CEB)

A few weeks ago, I spent some time one night working with AI (artificial intelligence) and wondered how it would explain the term “extremely grateful.” In a nanosecond, it brought back: “means to feel warm and friendly towards someone and to want to thank them. The word ‘extremely’ is used to emphasize that the quality being described is present to a great degree. For example, ‘I am extremely grateful to all the teachers for their help.’”

First, I think AI provided a satisfactory response. Secondly, I was intrigued by its use of “warm and friendly” as part of the response. So, I moved on to ask it for synonyms for grateful which it said were appreciative, glad of, indebted to, thankful, relieved, and touched.

When it comes to describing having or applying an attitude of extreme gratefulness, I would put it this way: “When you’re practicing the mindset of extreme gratitude, you focus on all the abundance around you; you focus on the positive things more than the negative things. This intense focus will allow you to manifest more positive things into your life.” If you want to see a spectrum of brilliant colors in your daily life, the fullness of God’s Creation, you can’t “see and experience” everything in black and white. We must trust what our eyes see, but there may also be more than our eyes and our minds can comprehend. God’s blessings are there, but it can be hard for us to see them.

September and October brought several opportunities to “see” and experience the Northern Lights, the aurora borealis, even here in Arkansas. Pictures were showing up all over social media, but I couldn’t really see the lights simply by looking into the night sky. When photos were taken with an iPhone, suddenly the beautiful colors were there with the stars dotting the image. I then pondered the times I see things around me in the dull, muted, and darkened colors of night and have missed the blessings dancing in waves of color that are hard for me to comprehend – and yet they’ve been there all the time. God is always with us. I’m extremely grateful.

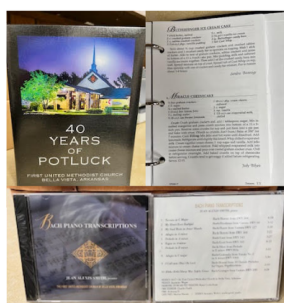

Each Sunday beginning November 10, cards will be open on card tables in the Narthex and Becker Hall for you to sign. Feel free to express greetings along with your signatures.

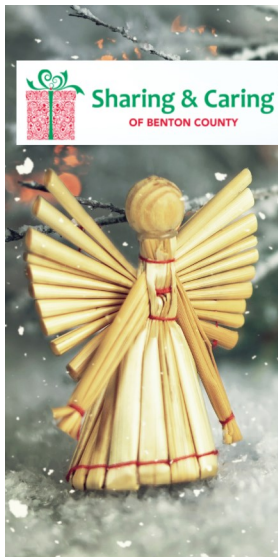

Our hope is that our homebound members will enjoy viewing many cards from their church family during the holiday season.

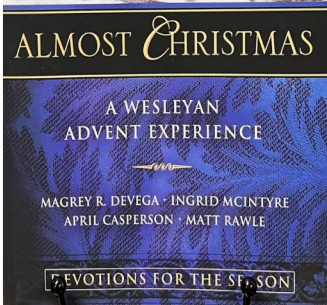
Thank you for your participation in this much-needed ministry for our homebound members during this Christmas Season!

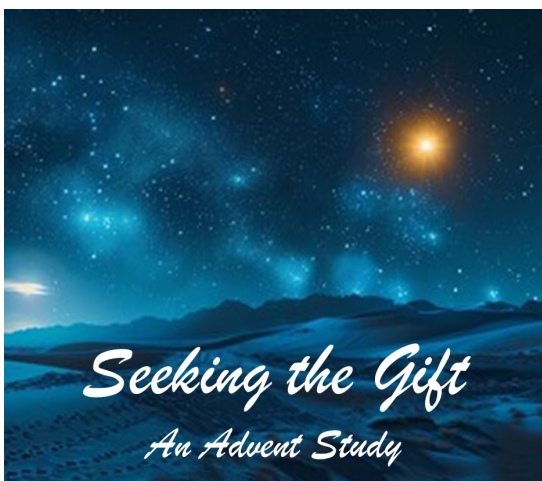
