Share a listening ear as someone needs to be heard but also be of good cheer yourself and help others see the upside, the bright side of life found in Christ. For me, in my first appointment as a lead pastor, this has been much like the pioneering work Paul mentions in these verses. It has been about bringing the Message and working to ensure that last verse:

The work of sharing the Gospel, the Good News, never ends. Luke does not record Paul declaring the work would always be joyful and easy. The path we walk is sometimes bumpy, dark, and difficult. Paul does challenge us to stay strong and hopeful. He does say we are to stay strong and able in our faith in Jesus and His saving grace. We are called to be doers.

As we move through the transitional month of June, what are you going to do to make this a magnificent transition in the ministry of FUMC Bella Vista? If asked, are you ready to say yes? What are you willing to volunteer to do - without even being asked? It's never wrong to go ahead and do something good in the name of Christ.






HELPING HANDS WORK DAY




